"To me it would not seem that a steward who faithfully surrenders his charge is diminished in love or in honour..."

No, this is not a Scripture passage, as you may already have gathered. It's a quote from *The Return of the King*, the 3rd volume of J.R.R. Tolkien's trilogy, *The Lord of the Rings.*

In this scene, Denethor, Steward in a long line of stewards of Gondor, loathes relinquishing the kingdom to the true king who has finally come in fulfillment of prophecy. Denethor's desire? – "To be Lord of the city in peace and leave my chair to a son after me... who would be his own master... but if doom denies me this, then I will have naught; neither life diminished, nor halved, nor honour abated." To this Gandalf replies, "To me it would not seem that a steward who faithfully surrenders his charge is diminished in love or in honour..."

When we, as stewards of God's gifts, faithfully surrender to God what God has entrusted to us, we are not diminished in love, or honor, or blessings...

As we prepare for Thanksgiving and the Church seasons of Advent and Christmas and enjoy not only the spiritual but also material blessings that God gives in special ways during this time of the year, I encourage you to think of your life of stewardship.

We usually think of stewardship in terms of money, but God sees stewardship as encompassing everything we are as well as everything we have. It involves our money, time, energy, effort, devotion, commitment, love, etc. In fact, stewardship encompasses our very life. What God wants first and foremost, above all else, is our heart, our mind, our body... in other words, He wants us. We belong to Him. He made us. He redeemed us with no less than the precious blood of His own Son, Jesus Christ (1Peter 1:18-19). He adopted as His sons and daughters by His grace through faith in His Son, Jesus, incorporating us into Christ in Baptism (Galatians 3:26-29; Romans 8:15b-17a).

Stewardship is not just one aspect of the Christian life; it is the Christian life. It is knowing and realizing that everything we are and everything we have are gifts from God (except that which is sinful, of course) and that we have been given the privilege and honor of taking care of, and using, these gifts in a God -pleasing and God-honoring way (Luke 19:12-13ff; cf. Matthew 25:14ff). When we return to the Lord what rightfully belongs to Him to begin with (Psalm 24:1; Deuteronomy 32:6b) and use His gifts, including our financial resources, time, mind, body, heart, etc., to serve Him, we are merely being faithful stewards (1Corinthians 4:1-2) and that does not diminish our honor

or life in any way but rather, God bestows His honor on us and blesses us even more. (Luke 6:38; Malachi 3:10).

I pray that by the power of Gospel, you will be faithful stewards of the riches God has given you and return to the Him what He has given you charge over (Malachi 3:7b) by serving Him with all that you are and all that you have. Faithfully surrender yourself to God who gave His Son for you, and He assures you, you will not be diminished in love, honor or blessings.

¹⁸Knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.




Holy Cross & YVCS Work Day, Sat, 11/10, 9am

- abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta;
- hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease;
- atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk;
- bone density screening, for men & women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis.

The following was read by Marilyn at Wilma's memorial service. We wanted to share it again with you.

Getting to know all about Wilma Burch, Conversations with Ann Caruso & Marilyn Neumann, February 11, 2014

We had a wonderful conversation with Wilma Burch. It was a blessing to visit with this elegant, gracious lady. We learned that she has a wonderful sense of humor and infectious laugh. During the course of our conversation Wilma told us that her favorite hymn is "Abide with Me', one of the most beautiful hymns ever written. Here are some of the highlights from our conversation with Wilma:

She was born in Battle Creek, Nebraska, located approx. 100 miles west of Sioux City, Iowa. There were 6 children in her family – 3 boys and 3 girls. Her maiden name was Klein. Wilma's parents were Missouri Synod Lutherans and she and her brothers and sisters were baptized as infants in the church.

At age 16 she went to work on her grandparents' farm. Wilma loved the summers working on the farm, helping her uncle with the haying. She learned to drive the horse drawn rakes which were used in the haying. After she graduated from High School, Wilma taught school in a one room school in Rock County, Nebraska. She had four students her first year and by the third year there were 13 students. Five of those 13 students were from the same family and the five of them rode together on one horse to school. She still hears from several of the students she taught. One of those students told her he never forgot learning the Palmer Method of Cursive Writing. (Remember the beautiful letters in cursive that used to line the walls of your classrooms in grammar school? That was the Palmer Method of Cursive Writing. Kids growing up today are taught how to print and have a difficult time reading cursive writing.)

Wilma and one of her girlfriends decided to come out to California to work. They lived in Rollingwood, a small suburb of Richmond. Wilma worked for Standard Oil as a Pumper. It was during the wartime and women were needed in the workforce while the men went off to serve in the armed forces. In the meantime, a certain young man back home named Lealand Burch had joined the Army and was stationed in California at Camp Roberts. He was sent to Alaska for two years. Wilma and Lealand fell in love, having been friends for so many years and went back to Nebraska for their wedding in 1944. They were married in the Pastor's Parsonage. Lealand worked for Standard Oil and later was hired by PG&E in the Construction Department. PG&E moved them around a lot to Walnut Creek, Monterey, Eureka, Santa Rosa, and then finally Concord. They started their family in Concord. They adopted a baby girl whom they named Leann, and then two years later, the Lord blessed them with a son, Bradley. She was active in the PTA, on Local and State Board level. She was elected to the Contra Costa County Board of Education and served 9 years on the Board.

Leann and her family live in Oregon near Salem, and Bradley lives in Walnut Creek. Wilma and her family were members of First Lutheran for many years and then came to Holy Cross about 15 years ago.

Lealand retired after 35 years with PG&E. Wilma and Lealand had a good life together. The Lord took Lealand home in 1993, and she misses him still. Wilma has enjoyed some wonderful trips, including Lutherland with Pastor Dale Meyer. She traveled on the Queen Elizabeth 2 around the coast of Great Britain. She saw the Passion Play in Germany, visited Italy, Spain, Portugal, the Canary Islands, Morocco, and Alaska. Before Christmas, she and her son Bradley boarded a cruise ship in Long Beach and sailed down the coast stopping at Catalina Island and Ensenada, Mexico.

We had such a blessing getting to know more about Wilma. We hope you received a blessing reading about our conversation.
