Pastor's Message

Above and beyond the indispensable gifts of the means of grace — namely God's word and the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion — the Holy Spirit has given gifts to each of you. These gifts meant to be used for the benefit and common good of the body of Christ (1Corinthians 12:7). St. Peter writes in 1Peter 4:10: "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

As Andrew Mundinger's ordination and installation draw near and you prepare for the transition to, and welcome of, a new pastor, I encourage you again to consider prayerfully how you will use your Spirit-given gifts to serve your Lord by serving, supporting, encouraging, and building up one another as, and within, the body of Christ at Holy Cross and to assist the new pastor. Pray the Spirit to give you the willingness to render such service in Jesus' name.

Andrew has been placed by Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne, and called by the Holy Spirit to serve you. He has received one of the finest theological educations available, which included a full year of in-the-ministry training (vicarage) in addition to three years of instruction in, and study of, the Biblical languages, exegetical theology, historical theology, practical theology, and systematic theology. He is well-versed in Scripture and Scriptural theology, and the Holy Spirit has given him gifts that will serve him well as he serves His Savior, the Good Shepherd, by serving you as your shepherd.

You will know where he stands theologically and doctrinally because during his ordination and installation, he will confess unequivocally what is the norm for his preaching and teaching and will promise to conform his preaching and teaching to those norms, namely Holy Scriptures (the norm that norms) and the Lutheran Confessions.

During Andrew's installation of as pastor of Holy Cross, you, members of Holy Cross, will be asked, "Will you now receive him, show him love, honor, and obedience in the Lord which you owe to the shepherd and teachers placed over you in your Lord Jesus Christ, and will you support him with your gifts and pray for him always that in his labors he may retain a cheerful spirit and that his ministry among you may be abundantly blessed? If so, answer, 'We will with the help of God."" By answering in the affirmative, implicitly you will be promising to use your gifts to minister to one another as brothers and sisters in Christ.

Seeking to inspire the people of the country to public service, President John F. Kennedy famously said in his inaugural address on January 20, 1961, "Ask not what your country can do for you — ask what you can do for your country."

God will bless each and everyone of you through Pastor-elect Andrew Mundinger's ministry among you as he preaches the Word and administers the Sacraments. That much is certain, because God promises His blessings where and when the means of grace are present.

What is not certain is whether and/or how each of you will use your gifts to build up each other in the faith, because that is for you to decide.

Many of you are serving in multiple capacities. Prayerfully consider adding one service more to your list; ask the Spirit to lead and enable you to do so.

If circumstances have been such that you've been unable to commit time and effort, ask the Lord to enable you to be able. If rather than a matter of ability, it has been a matter of willingness or thinking that somebody else can do it, pray the Spirit for willingness to serve and remember that you are that "somebody else" to everyone else.

Wherever a need arises within this body of Christ, ask what you — a redeemed child of God and member of the body of Christ gathered by the Holy Spirit at Holy Cross — can do to serve your Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ, by serving each other and supporting your pastor's ministry with the gifts the Holy Spirit has given you.

Support Community was the recipient for all funds raised by the Walk. The tally is not complete yet, as some mail-in donations and employer matching funds are still coming in, but here are some

statistics that you will find impressive.

- \$178,264 of the \$150,000 goal has been raised so far.
- Our team has raised over \$800. Our goal was \$500!
- The top team raised over \$8,000.
- There were 1,065 walkers, 3 from Holy Cross.
- There were 99 teams.
- There were 70 vendor tables with lots of information and giveaways. Some of the vendors were: UCSF Health, John Muir Health, the Oakland A's, and Kaiser Permanente to name a few.
- Sponsorship dollars for 2019: over \$58,000 (2018 was \$38,000)

This event was a wonderful, well organized experience. We met many caring people, and hugs were plentiful! Many cancer survivors participated in the walk, wearing their dark purple Hope Walk 2019 shirts. There were families, couples, work groups, children (some in strollers), many well-behaved dogs, grandparents, parents, siblings... We even had a big white "unicorn" and a swarm of six "butterflies". There was music playing for the entire event, and along the walk route there was entertainment: line dancers, ukulele players, a banjo group, high school cheerleaders and Oakland A's cheerleaders. Water stations were set up along the way and Sprouts contributed fresh fruit for the walkers. AND...we were dry for the entire walk!

Again, we are thankful for your prayers and donations. Joyce and I hope to do this again next year. Consider joining us for a fun day raising funds for the support of cancer victims and their families in our community.

Nifty Fifty

We are planning two outings for June. The first is to Mac's Old House located at 3100 18th St., Antioch on

June 6th at 1:00. As most of you know Mac's Old House is just that, an old house turned into a restaurant, and it certainly isn't anything fancy but it has great food. Drinks are \$2.50 for a single, \$3.00 for a double, and \$3.50 for a - as they state - really big triple. Needless to say the bar is always packed, as is the restaurant. They have fabulous mine-



strone soup and a selection of hot food that won't stop. I usually have the ground round steak luncheon, still \$6.50, which includes soup or salad and hot sourdough bread. Calamari, red snapper, prime rib, and a host of other great lunches are still \$10.50. When we used to play golf at Bethel Island we would always stop for lunch at Mac's Old House. Most of you have been there so you know how great it is. The only problem is we have to be there when they open at 11:30 or we cant sit together. It's cash only, 20% tip, and no separate checks. Meet at church at 10:45 to leave at 11:00 or go directly.

Our second outing is to another favorite, Peter's Steak House, in Isleton on Friday, June 21st, at 1:00. I always like to go there as it involves a drive through the Delta along the Sacramento River. The foliage on



the fruit trees and farm crops always remind me of what a beautiful area we live in. The town consists of old metal buildings, as a fire precaution, and the town is dramatically lower than the river you drive down from. The steak house has been com- \mathfrak{Se} pletely remodeled so the inside is inviting and clean. They have prime rib, fish and

chips, and a host of sandwiches. All lunches are served with a choice of green salad or steak fries. I like to have a bowl of their clam chowder and the fish and chips. Sign up in the parish hall so we know how many to plan on.


