I have diped there several times and have enjoyed their assortment of good food and specialties such as the Cedar-Plank Seafood and shrimp jambalaya (tender shrimp, sweet roasted peppers, onions, celery, andouille sausage, and spicy seasoning over wild rice). They currently have what they call the Admiral's Feast, and a 4-course feast Wednesdays and Thursdays, for \$15.00. Should be a delightful experience. The restaurant is located in the shopping center just off Somersville in Antioch. Those planning on carpooling should meet at church at 12:15 and leave at 12:30. Our second outing is to Black Angus Steakhouse located at 2355 Sand Creek Rd., Brentwood, on Thursday, May 23rd,
