A man told of his father's last hours. The family had gathered to say "goodbye." After visiting with each of them one at a time, the father called them all to his bedside. He looked silently at his family for a few moments. Then he turned away slowly and said, "God damn death!"

Whether or not this is a true story, "God damn death!" is a good take

on Easter and Christ's resurrection, because as St. Paul says in First Corinthians 15:

<sup>54</sup>..."Death is swallowed up in victory." <sup>55</sup>"O

death, where is your vic- tory? O death, where is your sting?" <sup>56</sup>The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. <sup>57</sup>But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1Corinthians 15)

Christ is risen; therefore we will be raised (1Cor.15:20-23). By His death, Christ atoned for our sins, the consequence of which is death; by His resurrection Christ overcame death. Jesus kept God's Law for us and offered His perfect life for our sins at the cross, paying the penalty we deserved with his suffering and death. Arising from the dead, Jesus destroyed death's power to keep us dead and hold us in the grave.

This is the Good News of Easter but it

is just for Easter. This Gospel is for every Sunday; indeed, it is for every day. And it is for everyone.

Jesus Himself says in John's Gospel: For God so loved that world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life... A time is coming when all who are in their graves will

hear His voice and
come out, those
who have done
good [believe in
Jesus] to the resurrection of life,
and those who have

done evil [reject Jesus] to the resurrection of judgment. (John 3:16; 5:28-29)

God gives the victory that Jesus won at the cross and the empty tomb to all who trust Jesus for salvation as a gift of His undeserved love, and even the faith that trusts Jesus is God's gift to us.

Death has been damned. It was damned when Christ arose from the dead. And by God's grace, all who trust Jesus Christ as Savior can say with certainty: "Death is damned." <sup>55</sup>"O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" <sup>56</sup>The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. <sup>57</sup>But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### Petite Cherry Cheese Cake

(Makes one dozen)

Cheese	Cake Ingredients:	Cherry	Glaze Ingredients:
1 C	Vanilla Wafer	2 C	Pitted Fresh Tart
	Crumbs		Cherries
31/2 TBS	Melted Butter or	3/4 C	Water
	Margarine	1/3 C	Sugar
1 Pkg	Cream Cheese (8 oz.),	1 TBS	Cornstarch
	Softened	1 TBS	Lemon Juice
1/3 C	Sugar	2-4 Dr	ops Food Coloring
1	Egg	(optio	nal)
2 tsp	Lemon Juice		
1/2 tsp	Vanilla Extract		
1/4 tsp	Almond Extract		

#### Directions:

1/4 tsp Salt

- Mix crumbs and butter in small bowl. Line 12 muffin cups with paper liners. Press about 1 tablespoon of the crumb mixture into each cup. Beat cream cheese in large mixer bowl until light and fluffy; beat in 1/3 cup sugar, the egg, 2 teaspoons lemon juice, the vanilla, almond extract and salt until smooth. Spoon about 1 tablespoon of the cheese mixture into each cup. Bake until set, about 15 minutes. Let stand 20 minutes; remove from tin. Cool completely on wire rack.
- 2. Heat cherries, 3/4 cup of water, 1/3 cup sugar and the food color in medium size saucepan over high heat, stirring constantly, to boiling; reduce heat to mediumhigh. Cook uncovered, stirring occasionally, until slightly thickened, about 15 minutes. Dissolve cornstarch in 1 tablespoon lemon juice; stir into cherry mixture. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thickened, about 1 minute. Transfer to small bowl. Cool completely.
- 3. Just before serving, remove cheesecakes from paper cups. Top each cheesecake with 1 tablespoon of the cherry glaze.

Tip: One can (16oz.) pie cherries, undrained, can be substituted for the 2 cups fresh cherries and 3/4 cup water.

The Conference theme was "Be Joyful in Hope". We spent most of the day inside the spacious, beautiful church. We sang with music played on the grand organ as well as with their contemporary music group — what a joyful sound our combined voices made! We listened to a thought provoking Devotion, and watched a skit reminding us of the LWML National Convention this June in Peoria, IL.

And of course, since we're Lutherans, the day included food - a delicious lunch and dessert that was served at our tables while we sat and visited with old and new friends.

For me, the best part of the day was the inspirational speaker, Ruth Koch. She spoke for 90 minutes before lunch, then another 90 minutes after lunch. Her energy, enthusiasm, and hope were contagious. She spoke on many thought provoking topics, getting us involved in small groups to discuss how they related to our life. As many times you do when talking with others, we realized how much we all have in common – our worries and hopes. Here are some highlights:

\* She said that worry is not a sin. She acknowledged that there are many things in our world that we are or can be concerned with; that life is not always fair. However she also said "It's not about me or you. It's about God. I don't fully know or understand it all, but I have faith in God's plan.". This was comforting. Also of comfort were the Bible verses she referenced:

#### John 16:33

I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.

#### **Ecclesiastes 3**

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven:

- a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot,
- a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build,
- a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance,
- a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain,
- a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away,
- a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak,
- a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.
- \* Another quote I noted, that paraphrases Ecclesiastes 7:14:

On a good day, enjoy yourself.

On a bad day, examine your conscious.

- \* Lastly, Ruth's 5 steps to lay hold of hope
- 1. Become a Sabbath keeper (ideas: take time to reflect; turn off the TV and computers).

- 3. You can get out of bed and into the world because God is at work.
- 4. You can have hope because you'll never have to visit the cave of Trophonius (look it up).
- 5. Peek at the end of the story we win.
