Prepare For Jesus' Advent

"Preparation" and "Advent" go hand in hand for the Church and Christians.

Advent is the season of preparation for Christmas. While we, and the rest of the world, prepare for Christmas with the blessings of shopping, gift-wrapping (and giving), decorating, baking, and planning get-togethers with family, etc., Christians have the added blessing of preparing to celebrate Christ's first advent or coming with Divine Service ("worship") that focuses on God's promises come true in the Christ.

In His first Advent, our Lord came as a "helpless" infant subject to the needs, frailty, and experiences of humanity yet was without sin. Divinity cloaked in humanity — He was King of kings and Lord of lords whose birth filled heaven and earth with the angelic hymn of praise to God who was fulfilling His promise and the hope of His people by sending the Messiah, the

Savior, His Son, Jesus, for the salvation of the world.

The appropriate preparation for Christmas? Cling to Jesus in faith by faithfully using the means of grace. Gather faithfully with God's people around Word and Sacrament to confess, worship, and praise God for the greatest and most needed gift: the Savior. Read the Scriptures, particularly the Gospels, and let God tell you the "what" and "why" of Christmas, that He so loved the world — and that includes you! — that He gave His only Son so that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life (John 3:16). Let the means of grace lead to repentance and the strengthening of your faith in Christ.

Advent is also a time that focuses on our preparation for Christ's promised second coming (Acts 1:11). Christ's first advent was in humility and people could, and still can, ignore Him, mock Him, dismiss Him. But His second advent will be quite different: He will come in power and glory to judge the living and the dead:

<u>Matthew 16:27</u> — For the Son of Man is going to come

with his angels in the glory of his Father and then he will repay each person according to what he has done. Matthew 24:30c — And they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. 1Thessalonians 4:16 — For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. (See Matthew 25:31-46. See also the Creeds: Apostles', Nicene. Athanasian).

Our Lord could return any day. The appropriate preparation for the Lord's second advent? Same as for the first: Cling to Jesus in faith by faithfully using the means of grace. Worship faithfully. Read and study the Scriptures and receive the Sacrament regularly. In addition? Share the Good News that the Christ born in Bethlehem came to die to atone for the sins of the world on Good Friday, arise from the dead on Easter, and ascend to heaven for our salvation. Share this Gospel that alone can bring sinners to faith in Jesus with all people, but especially with unbelievers, to prepare them for the Lord's coming with faith in Jesus as Savior

A blessed Advent and Christmas to you! And the peace of the Lord be with you!
