So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls. And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (Acts 2:41-42)

Our Lord Jesus describes Christian discipleship as follows:

"If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. (Luke 9:23) Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. (Luke 14:27)

I think it's fair to say that we will not deny ourselves what we really want or need but will find time, energy, and money to attend to what we deem important, necessary, and priority.
