Schedule

Each Wednesday evening during Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 9, we will come together for worship. Our Ash Wednesday worship service will make use of ashes as part of the confession of sins. Ashes remind us of our sins and our mortality due to sin; ashes also symbolize our confession, humility, and repentance as we receive forgiveness in the Absolution, the Scriptures, and the Lord's Supper. Our focus for the remaining evening services will be on some of the people who had a hand in, or were around, Jesus' crucifixion and how God might use each to teach and to move us to repentance and greater faithfulness to Christ.

Many Lutheran congregations still maintain the tradition of Lenten midweek services along with the tradition of a supper before the service, even

though interest in this these Lenten traditions has been dwindling. There are a number of reasons why most Christians do not participate in midweek Lenten service.

First, we are busy people, and it is difficult to fit yet another event into our already full calendar.

Second, it is difficult for some to drive at night, especially in inclement weather.

Third, churches read the "signs of the times" and determine that such traditions are no longer "relevant" (though I wonder whether churches are only reflecting what is/is not "relevant" in the culture

or are actually defining what is/is not relevant).

Fourth, increasingly we think of worship as just a "Sunday" thing, so that additional worship services are superfluous.

In spite of the obstacles to participating, I invite you and encourage you to join in our Wednesday evening suppers and worship services during Lent for fellowship and the

Word of God.

And whether you are able to attend these evenings or not, I encourage you to engage in a personal time of worship and devotion. Set aside time each day, even if it's only for 15-20 minutes, to read the Bible and to pray. Read and study Martin's Luther's Small Catechism. Bless your days and lives during Lent with the Word of God.

who would like them.








