

## Movies are rarely good sources for truth...



"Noah" (released March 28, 2014) and "Heaven Is For Real" (released Holy Week, 2014). Since I have not watched either (and I don't intend to), I cannot offer a review. However, I would offer a caution and an encouragement.

First, a caution: Don't base your faith in Christ or the authority of Scripture on movies.

Even a cursory parsing of the carefully worded explanation on the homepage of the official website for "Noah" should dispel any notion that the movie could serve as an anchor for our Christian faith or knowledge of Noah: "The film is inspired by the story of Noah. While artistic license has been taken, we believe that this film is true to the essence, values and integrity of a story that is a cornerstone of faith for millions of people worldwide. The biblical story of Noah can be found in the book of Genesis."(1)

Darren Aronofsky, the director, bluntly stated in a Washington Post interview, "My job is first and foremost as an entertainer. I entertain people, and I try to make films that are exciting, and fun, and emotional, and moving, and filled with action, and that's all I care about."(2) He also reportedly told a staff writer of The New Yorker that "Noah" is "the least Biblical film ever made."(3)

Dr. Albert Mohler offers an incisive review of "Noah" on his website.(4)

"Heaven Is For Real" is based on



a book with the same title published in 2010. The book is narrated by Pastor Todd Burpo, who recounts the details of a journey to and from heaven that his son, Colton, claimed to have made during a near-death experience following a ruptured appendix in 2003, when he was not yet 4 years old.

The book (as does, I assume, the movie) makes substantial claims about heaven and God that go beyond what Scripture reveals but which are presented as definitive truth that substantiate Scripture and that the readers (and presumably viewers of the movie) are supposed to take at face value. (Cf. Isaiah 6:1-4, Ezekiel 1 & 10, Revelation 4-6)

Descriptions of what Colton saw in heaven are posted on the Burpos' "Heaven Is For Real Ministry" website, including the following: "Colton describes God the Father... He remembers that the angel Gabriel is the being in heaven that most resembles God the Father. The colors Gabriel had on his clothes were the same colors that God the Father wore. Also, God the Father had wings just like Gabriel did."(5) He also describes Jesus' physical characteristics.

We don't dispute that heaven is for real. Scripture says it's real. However, "Heaven Is For Real" — whether the book or movie version — is a poor, flimsy foundation for our faith, understanding, and hope.

Dr. Jeffrey Gibbs (Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO) gives an insightful review of the book.(6)

Now the encouragement: Enjoy movies, including "Noah" and "Heaven Is For Real," for what they are — entertainment. But for truth on Noah and the flood, heaven, God, salvation, Word and Sacrament, Christ's incarnation, birth, childhood, life, crucifix-

ion, resurrection, ascension, and second coming, etc., go to the source of all truth: Scripture, the Word of God.

<sup>16</sup>For we did not follow cleverly devised muths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty... <sup>19</sup>And we have something more sure, the prophetic word, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts, <sup>20</sup>knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. 21For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit. (2Peter 1:16, 19-21)

<sup>14</sup>But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it <sup>15</sup>and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. <sup>16</sup> All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup>that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. (2Tim 3:14-17)

These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name. (John 20:31)

## PARKING LOT UPDATE MAY 1, 2014

The paper bin at the end of the parking lot was removed April 15. There is a paper recycle bin (blue) near the trash bin area. This is for Church use only. PLEASE PLACE ONLY CLEAN PAPER AND CARDBOARD in this bin – no plastic. If there are paper products that contain food residue, they are to be disposed of in the trash bin.

The committee has been in contact with PG & E and the City of Concord regarding the tree removal by PG & E. There has been a number of articles in the CONTRA COSTA TIMES regarding the discussions between cities and PG &E. There are issues that need to be resolved before the removal takes place. We are hopeful this will not be a setback to our timeline.

For the month of March \$564 was added to the restricted fund for the parking lot.

At the April 21, 2014 meeting the Church Council approved the removal of the pine tree near the parking lot entrance. The recommendation was made because of dead branches. Dead wood in this tree is an ongoing problem. Additionally, the tree roots are raising the driveway section of the asphalt and causing a safety issue.


