SCRATCH ITCHING EARS OR PROCLAIM CHRIST?


³For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, ⁴ and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. (2Timothy 4:3-4)

No doubt Pope Francis scratched many "itching ears" with his response to the founder of Italian newspaper, La Repubblica. Tucked in his letter was the offer of salvation to sinners apart from faith in Jesus Christ:

... You ask if the God of the Christians forgives those who do not believe and do not seek faith. Given that - and this is fundamental - God's mercy has no limits if he who asks for mercy does so in contrition and with a sincere heart, the issue for those who do not believe in God is in obeying their own conscience. In fact, listening and obeying it, means deciding about what is perceived to be good or to be evil. The goodness or the wickedness of our behavior depends on this decision. This affirms what the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: 847...Those who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart, and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do his will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience - those too may achieve eternal salvation. (http://www.vatican.va/archive/ENG0015/_P29.HTM#-14G)

God is merciful (Titus 3:5).



However, we dare not separate God's mercy or our salvation from Jesus Christ, whose death alone atones for sin. To do so is to teach false doctrine and give false hope: "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God." (John 3:17-18)

St. Paul writes in Galatians: "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel— not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed." (Galatians

1:6-8) Because "the word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing" [and have "itching ears"], he writes in 1Corinthians 1:18, "but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."

A "gospel" that scratches "itching ears" by catering to those who want "salvation" in anything or anyone other than Christ crucified is no good news at all; it might help us keep us peace with those who hold divergent views on "salvation, but it will not offer peace and reconciliation with God which comes only through Christ's saving work... it will not save.

The Pope's words are a reminder that the "Solas" of the Reformation — sola gratia (grace alone), sola fide (faith alone), sola Scriptura (Scripture alone) - are no less relevant today than it was in the 16th century and that the need is as great as ever for us and all Christians to stand on the Word of God and proclaim that sinners are saved by God's grace (undeserved love) through faith in Jesus Christ and this know from the Word of God, which creates and sustains saving faith that trusts Jesus as Savior... because there is no other Gospel.₽





"Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum"

Latin for "The Word of the Lord Endures Forever," this motto of the Lutheran arm of the Protestant Reformation comes from 1 Peter 1:25. Frederick the Wise, ruler of Saxony and one of Martin Luther's earliest and most powerful defenders, had the VDMA symbol sewn into the right sleeve of the official garments of his court. The symbol also appeared on banners, flags, swords and uniforms, representing the unity of the Lutheran laity in defending their beliefs.

BREAKFAST CASSEROLE RECIPE FROM BRUNCH

20 oz. bag of frozen hash browns, thawed

8 T melted butter

2 C. Monterey Jack cheese, grated

1 C. Cheddar cheese, grated

12 eggs

3/4 C. milk

1 & 1/2 C. cubed ham or 1 package sausage, cooked

Preheat oven to 425 degrees.

Press hash browns into an 13"x 9" baking dish, brush with melted butter and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Bake 25 minutes at 425 degrees.

Mix eggs, cheese, milk and meat. Pour over hash browns. Bake 15 minutes covered and 20 minutes uncovered at 350 degrees.
