For all our wishes and longing for peace on earth, peace is not always easy to come by. Gospel Outreach -Article for Grants, 2013-2014

Praise God that we can announce that District Mission Grant #1: Zion Zone After School and Summer Program of \$22,650 has been funded.

Grant #2: \$6000 for Dream Catcher Youth Group North Cheyenne Reservation near Lame Deer, Montana, L.C.M.S. It is for Native American youth on the reservation who are desperately in need of positive activities, good adult role models, and the Good News

of Jesus Christ to give them hope, guidance, and counsel as they grow up in a cultural setting that often does little to encourage their faith, self-esteem, and positive personal choices. These grants will provide food and materials from Jan. 2013 to August 2014. Mentors are not paid a salary. These young people struggle with being Native American and following Christ. This grant is about \$1500 short of being funded.

Our #3 grant will be for \$5000. It is for Production of Braille Magazines, Lutheran Blind Mission. Many publishers of resources for blind and visually impaired are going out of business due to economic conditions. Many L.W. M. L. women volunteer to help prepare the plates for the magazines. Lutheran Blind Mission, in the course of a year produces seven different magazines in Braille. These magazines are provided at no cost to the reader. Costs involved include Braille paper production plates and mailing envelopes. This grant will assist with Braille production of 'His Hands', 'Lutheran Digest', 'Lutheran Messenger', 'Lutheran Witness', 'L.W. M. L. Quarterly', 'My Devotions', 'Portals of Prayer' and 'Today's Light'. When you pick one of these magazines up, think about the involvement of our L.W.M.L.

One of the season's symbolic colors is blue, representing hope. I was born and raised in Eastern Colorado in a small town called Flagler. I began piano lessons at the age of six and studied under Mrs. L. McBride and Mrs. Y. Herbert for the next 10 years. As a fifth grader I began playing for the Sunday School opening at my home con-

gregation of Zion Lutheran. After rudimentary organ instruction from my older sister, I then moved to playing for worship services at my home congregation and our neighboring sister congregation during my junior high and high school years.

While attending Concordia Teachers College in Seward, Nebraska, I was privileged to study organ under the late Dr. Paul Rosel and Professor David Schack. My first call as an educator was to Hayward Lutheran School in Hayward, CA. It included service as full time organist. During the years in Hayward, I served as the full time organist for one year at Grace Lutheran and the following eight years at Good Shepherd Lutheran while continuing to teach full time in the school. After accepting a call to Prince of Peace Lutheran as a teacher, I continued my playing the organ as a substitute in the East Bay and South Bay regions. While I was teaching at Redeemer Lutheran in Redwood City, I was once again a full time organist. Eight years ago, I moved to St. Luke Lutheran in Santa Rosa to serve as principal and served as a part time organist. The past ten months I served as the full time organist at St. John's Lutheran in Petaluma, CA.

After my initial work here at Holy Cross Lutheran, I do so appreciate the enthusiasm and graciousness of staff and members.
