Only One Way to Heaven

One of the trends in 2011 was that many Americans believe all religions teach the same basic doctrines. According to George Barna, "43% of Americans said it doesn't matter what religious faith you follow because they all teach the same lessons" and "half of Americans (50%) believe that all people are eventually saved or accepted by God no matter what they do, [and only] 40% disagreed." (http://www.barna.org/faith-spirituality/543-top-trends-of-2011-changing-role-of-christianity)

I suspect that this trend will not reverse any time soon and that not a small number of those who subscribe to this universalism and religious pluralism describe themselves as "Christian." But whether "Christian" or not, they are sadly mistaken as to how one is saved and will be rudely awaken when they stand alone before God in judgment, with no Savior. Faith in Christ and His saving work on the cross saves; no one else can and nothing will.

Many try to reduce Christianity and God to what they can live with: "love." "Christianity is about love," they say, or "God is love," as if they could reduce God to nothing but "love" and strip the Bible of all its teachings but "love." Contrary to popular belief, Christianity is not primarily about love as in the "Golden Rule." It is not even

about loving God above all else. And the Bible isn't primarily a "How-to" book for living a good life.

St. John reveals the purpose of the Bible: ³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name. (John 20). Christianity and the Bible are about Jesus Christ and His incarnation, life, death, and resurrection for the purpose of saving humanity from sin and eternal death.

God is love but He is not just love. He is also holy, righteous, and just (among other attributes). God's love cannot be understood apart from His actions in Christ. Jesus affirms this in John 3: ¹⁶"For God <u>so loved the world, that he</u> gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life... ¹⁸Whoever believes in him is not condemned, **but** whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. St. Peter, speaking of the Crucified and Risen Christ, puts to rest any notion "Christians" and non-Christians may have that all spiritual/religious roads lead to heaven: "...There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name

under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

As much as some may want, salvation is neither by majority vote nor by politically correctly convention. It is by God's grace through faith in Jesus who gave His life to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the world. All have sinned. The wages of sin is death. The free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus. (Romans 3:23; 6:23)

Lent is that time of the church year that sharply focuses us on these facts. The ashes of Ash Wednesday remind us of our sinfulness and our need for repentance for forgiveness, repentance brought about by the power of the Spirit working His Word. Holy Week directs us to Christ and His suffering, death and resurrection for our forgiveness and salvation.

Jesus conquered sin, death, and the devil. His victory is ours through faith in Him and Him alone. Heaven is ours by faith in Christ, the only Way. 🕆



Ash Wednesday February 22

Ash Wednesday begins a forty day period during which Christians remember their sinfulness, repent, ask God's forgiveness, and recognize that God's forgiveness comes at an infinite price -- the death of Christ on the cross on our behalf. It is not meant as a time of false humility or prideful self-sacrifice. It reminds us that our sin separates us from God, who "demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners. Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8).

We observe the beginning of this period with a special

CPR

Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation

Cardio = HEART Pulmonary = LUNGS Resuscitate = REVIVE CPR = Reviving the Heart and Lungs

In February, we think of Valentine's day where the decoration of choice is the heart. What better month to think about CPR! Here is a refresher of the main points of CPR. Note, that a few things have changed in the past few years.

Note: The Main goal of CPR is to get the heart to circulate the blood in the body. The main goal of someone performing CPR is to keep the blood moving in the body until advanced care arrives.

- 1. When you come to an environment where you feel someone is in need of assistance check to make sure the area is safe, do not make yourself another victim
- 2. If there is an unresponsive person
 Call 911 advanced care as soon as possible is the key for serious conditions (for children perform 2 minutes CPR before calling)
- 3. IF an AED machine is available it should be used for cardiac victims these machines are found in various public places like the mall and museums.
- 4. Persorm CPR on unresponsive persons who are not breathing Push HARD and FAST while doing chest compressions (breaths are now optional if you do not feel comfortable

Adult victims - 30 chest compressions with two hands with 2 breaths) compressions are at 100 compressions per minute (Head Tilt Chin lift for breaths) Child victim - one hand chest compressions 30 compressions 2 breaths 100 compressions per minute (Head tlit Chin lift)

infant victim - two finger chest compression 30 compressions 2 breaths 100 compressions per minute (slight head tilt - cover nose and mouth of infant with mouth for breaths)

- 5. there is no need to stop compressions to check for a pulse
- 6. If there is another rescuer, rotate every 5 CPR cycles
- 7. Stop CPR if the scene becomes unsafe, you are too tired to continue, or Help arrives and Help takes over.

Jack's Bible study on December 12, 2011

- 1. The Christmas celebration is an opportunity for believers to express JOY as grateful recipients of God's grace in sending his son as Jesus into the world to be our savior.
 - a. We express our joy in love as taught by Jesus love for God and love for each other AND we turn down our love for the world.
 - i. We worship, singing love songs to God.
 - ii. We express love of friends, family and those in need by personal contacts and giving gifts.
- 2. <u>The world</u> tries to divide our attention from the "Reason for the season" <u>so</u> we must pray, worship and meditate on the profound and extraordinary truth of what God has done through the life of Jesus.
 - a. <u>To find the truth that "sets us free"</u> we must open our eyes and seek the Lord. We search the scriptures for words God has spoken to mankind over thousands of years. <u>We must respond to the truth</u> which has instructions as to how we are to live.
- 3 Let us now review facts which, with the Holy Spirit's power, can strengthen our faith in the Lord Jesus.
 - a. The Holy Scriptures tell us that the triune "God created the heavens and the earth". (Gen 1 & John 1)
 - b. As mankind turned away from God to appease trivial personal desires, God persisted in loving education to restore man's spiritual integrity.
 - c. God spoke his words of spiritual wisdom through prophets he chose, instructed, and empowered. Through the prophets, he prescribed punishment for violations of his laws and told mankind he would provide a savior who would take our punishment and save those who believed.
 - d. The prophets included Moses, of whom Jesus sad "he wrote about me"-and the Lord said to Moses, "I will raise up a prophet like you from among their brothers; I will put my words in his mouth and he will tell them everything I command him." (this was 1500 years before Jesus was born) We recall the power given to Moses by God as he confronted Egyptian pharaohs and parted the Red Sea.

I'll mention only one other prophet Isaiah to whom God spoke in detail regarding the savior.

I'm sure you remember many of Isaiah's revelations. For example: 53:5 "We all like sheep have gone astray each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all." Isaiah also records the Lord's words: The Lord says to Israel (49:6) "It is too small a thing for you to be my servant to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back those of Israel I have kept. I will make you a light for the gentiles that you may bring my salvation to the ends of the earth."

So, Jesus, a son of Israel, fulfills the Lord's promise. Paul quotes these words in his ministry to Antioch in Acts 13:47.

We are called, as Jesus' followers to put our faith in him alone; he is our hope of salvation. How do we realize that hope? Isaiah 55:6-11 says "Seek the Lord while he may be found, call on him while he is near – turn to the Lord and he will have mercy on [him] us – for he will freely pardon."

In our time there are many sources in the world which cultivate an attitude of arrogance in us and give us the illusion that we are God. To this worldly attitude, God says in Isaiah 55:9 "My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts"

God sent us Jesus in fulfillment of (O. T.) his prophecies and promises. He identified him at birth by providing the forecast sign "born of a virgin". Jesus was attended by angels before birth and at birth, identified by "wise men" who were led to the scene by supernatural signs in the heavens. And when the ruler of Jerusalem heard of his significance from the wise men, he killed many children to eliminate potential loss of his power to the newborn but was frustrated by another angelic intervention sending Joseph, Mary and Jesus out of his realm.

We remember that Jesus grew up as an ordinary man, Joe the carpenter's son. His behavior was perfect and he manifested extraordinary talents at a young age teaching in the temple. He had no worldly status.

We are well aware of Jesus 'miracles and teaching in his adult life – and of his crucifixion and resurrection. He was sacrificed to provide his faithful with the means of grace – taking upon himself the punishment we all deserve.

Indeed we have much to celebrate at Christmas. And we are now reminded of the power of the Christian faith by recently reported statistics: Christianity numbers 2.2 billion people worldwide.
