...God is our refuge and strength...

Psalm 46 offers comfort and hope that transcend circumstances. Whether those circumstances are of our own making or beyond our control, God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble (v.1).

The psalm is as timely today as it was when it was composed.

Our particulars may be different but our need for an anchor and security that are outside the instability and uncertainty of our circumstances is as great today as it was then. The Psalmist might as well have been addressing our world.

We see kingdoms raging and tottering (v.6), for example, in the Middle East. Wars and skirmishes rage in Iraq, Afghanistan, Lybia, Yeman, and elsewhere. Percolating unrest threatens to explode into full-scale riots and uprising in many countries due to economic crises and political oppression. We've also had horrendous natural disasters of fire, floods, tornados, hurricanes, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, and tsunamis.

And if wars or natural disasters have not impacted our physical and emotional welfare directly, all of us have faced or will face personal tragedies, crises, and other difficulties — health problems, death of loved ones and one day our own death, financial crises, relationship issues, etc.

Yet... God is God. He is omniscient; He Please pass the word out knows our plight. He is omnipresent; He is with us. He is omnipotent; He has (See pg. 6 for more info) the power to be our refuge and strength. God is also gracious and merciful — so gracious and merciful that in the fullness of time, as promised, He sent forth His Son to redeem us — so that He is our refuge and strength in our uncertain times and unstable world, and against sin, Satan, and death, and we can be still and know that He is God and trust His power, His goodness, His Word.

With God as God, with Christ as our Savior, we can confess with the psalmist:

¹God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

²Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, 3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling.

⁴There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. ⁵God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns.

⁶The nations rage, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. ⁷The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

⁸Come, behold the works of the LORD, how he has brought desolations on the earth. ⁹He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the chariots with fire.

¹⁰"Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!" 11 The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

it was time to leave for the depot. We had a modern great car with oversized windows to enjoy the journey back to Martinez.



Recipes

VICTORIAN EGGS FLORENTINE CASSEROLE

6 eggs, slightly beaten 1 lb. cottage cheese 1 cube butter, softened

½ lb. Swiss cheese, grated 1 pkg frozen chopped spinach

1 pkg frozen chopped spinach, cooked and drained ½ lb. feta cheese

½ lb. feta chees Grated nutmeg

Combine the eggs, all three cheeses, and the butter. Mix well. Add the spinach and nutmeg to the egg mixture. Pour into a greased two quart baking dish and bake 1 hour at 325° or until knife inserted comes out clean. Serves 8-10. This is particularly good served with broiled Jersey tomato halves.

SAUSAGE-EGG CASSEROLE

1 lb. bulk sausage (about 12 ounces)

6 eggs 2 cups milk

1 teaspoon salt

1 cup grated cheese

2 or 3 slices bread, cubed

1 teaspoon dry mustard

Brown and drain the sausage. Beat the eggs with the milk, salt, and mustard. Place the bread cubes in the bottom of a 9" x 13" buttered casserole dish. Crumble the sausage over the bread, top with the cheese, and pour the egg mixture over all. Refrigerate overnight. Bake at 350° for 40 minutes. Serves 8-10

It is an easy and fast dish to serve; you can double the recipe for larger groups.

BREAKFAST POTATOES CASSEROLE

1 – 32oz. pkg. frozen hashed brown potatoes

½ cup butter, melted

1 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. pepper

1/2 cup chopped onion

1 can cream of chicken soup

8 oz. sour cream

10 oz. shredded cheddar cheese

2 cups crushed corn flakes

14 cup melted butter

Thaw potatoes, mix with next 7 ingredients. For topping, combine cornflakes and butter and sprinkle over potato mixture. Bake 1 hr. at 350º in 9" x 13" dish. Serves 8-10.
