ITCHING EARS

16 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness. (2Timothy 3)

¹I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: ²Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching.

³For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, ⁴and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths.

(2Timothy 4)

St. Paul wrote these words to Timothy, a younger pastor and his "dear son in the faith" (1Tim.1:2; 2Tim.1:2), to encour-

age him in his ministry. But every generation has seen the fulfillment of Paul's prophetic words and needed to hear Paul's encouragement and to heed his commands.

The time has come again, in our time, when many within Christendom do not and will not tolerate the sound teaching of Scripture. For example, many Christians subscribe to "Deeds, not Creeds" and argue that the Church's focus ought to be what we do rather than what we believe and teach. The irony is. "Deeds, not Creeds" is also a doctrine, just not a Scriptural one. Others take a utilitarian approach to the Scriptures: whatever promotes their agenda and goal is good, otherwise disregard. And at times, all of us have fallen into this trap of accepting those parts of Scripture we agree with and discarding those we take issue with as "outdated."

To those with itching ears who pick and choose which part of Scripture to accept, and who will listen only to teachers and preachers who suit their passions, and turn away from the truth and wander into myths (this refers to some Christians most of the times, and probably all Christians some of the time), Paul com-

mands: ²Preach the word: be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. Will these words guarantee that people will listen? No! In, fact, they may think we are fools. Still, they, just as we, need to hear Scripture preached and taught for what it is: God's Word, which is *profitable for* teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness. They, just as we, need to hear God's Word both of Law. that warns and condemns us for

Dump Cake Recipe

Ingredients

#2 can crushed pineapple

#2 can cherry pie-mix or apple pie slices 1 box yellow cake mix

1 cup chopped walnuts (any nuts) 1 cup shredded coconut

1 cube Oleo, melted

Pre-heat oven to 350 degree F. Using a baking pan, size 13" x 9" put ingredients in layers as follow:

- 1. dump in cans of pineapple
- 2. Pour 1/2 box of cake mix
- 3. Layer cherry pie mix
- 4. Pour in the rest of cake mix
- 5. Spread layer of walnuts
- 6. Spread coconut on top of walnuts
- 7. Drizzle melted Oleo on top

Bake one hour in 350 degree oven. (Lay a sheet of aluminum over cake for the first 40 minutes so coconut does not get too crispy.) Courtesy of Wilma Burch
