# Rev. Matthew Harrison, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry

in his address to the delegates of the 2010 LCMS convention following his election as the 13<sup>th</sup> president of the synod, said, "I wish to inform you that you have kept your perfect record of electing sinners as presidents of the Missouri Synod. I guarantee you I will sin and fail. I will fall short."

Obviously, Harrison wasn't boasting about his sinfulness; he was humbly
admitting that though a
saint by virtue of God's
grace through faith in
Christ who died on the
cross to atone for the
sins of the world, he
(Harrison) remained a
sinner who would continue to sin but live by the
forgiving love of God in
Christ.

Harrison's words echoed the truth St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Romans: <sup>15</sup>For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate... <sup>18</sup>For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is,

in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. <sup>19</sup>For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing... <sup>24</sup>Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? <sup>25</sup>Thanks be to God

sinful nature, Paul described the plight of all Christians. Our problem in our life of sanctification — in living our Christian faith — is not that we don't know what God's Law says. It's not that we don't know what God wants us to do. Our problem is that we can't do perfectly what God

wants us to do. Our struggle is that often we don't do what we know to be godly and god-pleasing; we do the opposite.

This is why Lutheran preaching historically has been a Law and Gospel approach:

- 1.To hold before us sinners God's Law God to tell us what God requires and show us that we do not and cannot please God on our own.
- 7 2. And to proclaim the Gospel to show us what Christ has done for our salvation, give us faith to trust in Him as Savior, assure us of forgiveness, and strengthen us with the grace of God to enable us to lead a Godly life.

The great "solas" of the Reformation — sola gratia (by grace alone), sola fide (by faith alone), sola scriptura (by Scripture alone)... and solus Christus (Christ alone) restored to the church's conscience

the inviolable Scriptural truth that God justifies us (declares us "not guilty") by grace alone, through faith alone, on account of Christ alone, and this we know by Scripture alone. These solas are also indispensable in our Christian life, as clearly stated by St. Paul. We are not saved by works but by God's grace. Neither are we able to live a godly life merely by our own efforts; rather we live our Christian life by God's grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone by the power the Holy Spirit working through the Gospel.

I'm sure this comes as no surprise to any of you: I too am a sinner, and I will sin, every day. I don't say this with any arrogance or pride, but with utmost humility and thankfulness to God that I am saved and am a forgiven sinner, just like St. Paul, redeemed by the blood of the Son of God who was crucified to atone for my sins, your sins, and the sins of the world.

September 5, 2010

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
