# The Gifts of the Holy Spirit By Pastor Mundinger

By the time you read this we as a church will have celebrated one of the most important festivals of the church year, Pentecost. For a lot of people in the world this day will go by unnoticed. There are no secular attachments to this day like we see with Christmas or Easter. While we may not see any cultural reminders around us, such as Christmas trees, ornaments, presents, Easter eggs, jelly beans, or really any traditions at all; I am constantly reminded of this wonderful event every time I see the astonishing gifts that the Holy Spirit has poured out into the church.

Pentecost isn't just a one-day event. Every time we gather in the name of our Lord, we experience Pentecost all over again. Through the preaching of the Gospel of Christ and through Holy Baptism, the Holy Spirit calls and gathers believers to Christ and His Church. Church is a constant reminder that the Holy Spirit's activity continues today.

I am also reminded of the work of the Holy Spirit whenever I see all the wonderful gifts that he has given each and every one of you to serve His church and our neighbors. The Apostle Paul speaks of these gifts in his first letter to the church at Corinth when he writes, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone."



The Holy Spirit has given us all unique gifts for the betterment of His holy Church. Just like each member of our bodies has a different function, so too our gifts may be different but they are given to us by the same Spirit, that same Spirit which poured out His gifts on the Apostles that first Pentecost. Each unique gift helps build up the body, that is, it helps the church.


We are so very proud of what they have accomplished & pray their future dreams are all fulfilled.

We are unsure of the future, but we pray that God's love is still shown during this time.

I am happy to report that the Project 24 managers have been able to visit the children in their respective homes and have distributed food to their families during this pandemic. We will continue to do that once a month, to ensure that the children are doing well. It is nice to see the local Lutheran church continue to give mercy aid to those who need it most.
