Thy Will Be Done. **By Pastor Mundinger**

Personally, I believe that one of the hardest things for a Christian to believe is the third petition of the Lord's Prayer; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Of course we pray this petition every time we pray the Lord's Prayer (which should be everyday) but how often do we actually stop and ponder about its implications. How often do we really want the Lord's will to be done in our lives? If you are like me, a selfish sinner, then this can be a hard prayer to put my faith and trust in. Of course I pray that the Lord's will will be done in my life and in the life of the church and in the world, but sometimes His will can go against the will of my sinful flesh and I don't like that very much. Sometimes I think that I know better than God as if I know what's best for my own life.

We are now four days away from what seems like the most polarized and heated election in the history of the United States (granted the first election I actually remember was the 2000 election). For both sides of the political spectrum there is a lot at stake and both sides speak as if the world will end if the "other guy" wins. It's easy for us as Christians to get sucked into this way of thinking, but instead of going down the path of dread and despair we are called to go to God in prayer. Have you stopped and prayed to our Heavenly Father, Thy will be done? And if so, did you actually mean it? Do you trust that no matter who gets elected God is the one in control and that His will is being

done, regardless if we like it or not?

We should remember the Lord's response to the prophet Habakkuk, who was distraught over the violence and injustice done in Israel. Habakkuk cries out to God, "O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? Why do you make me see iniquity, and why do you idly look at wrong? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. So the law is paralyzed, and justice never goes forth. For the wicked surround the righteous; so justice goes forth perverted." Habakkuk cannot understand why God is allowing all of this to happen to His people.

God responded to Habakkuk saying, "Look among the nations, and see; wonder and be astounded. For I am doing a work in your days that you would not believe if told."

Even if God told Habakkuk every little detail about His plan, he still would be unable to comprehend it. God goes on to tell Habakkuk that He is raising an army, The Babylonians, who will come to bring judgment to Israel and lay waste to the land. Habakkuk again complains to the Lord because the Babylonians are even worse than the wicked Israelites. God responds to this complaint, promising that there is good coming out of all this chaos and destruction, things that no man could comprehend. He also promises that Babylon will be crushed as well, their violence will not go unpunished. He will use this corrupt nation for the ultimate good of His people. Ultimately we know the good that comes out of all of this, which is the eventual arrival of the Son of God incarnate, Jesus Christ, which brings about the salvation of all mankind. At the time it was impossible for Habakkuk to see all the good that was going to come from these events. Indeed, Thy will be done.

God tells Habakkuk that the righteous shall live by faith. Habakkuk has this divine promise that regardless of what happens around him, he is to have faith in the Lord and trust that he will deliver His people. We are called to do the same in this election. No matter who wins we are called to trust that the Lord still reigns over heaven and earth. God has used corrupt leaders (King Nebecanezzor, Cyrus, and Caesar) in the past to exercise His will and we better believe that His will will continue to be done in our present time.

Ultimately we know that the Lord will be faithful to his called children. We know and believe that no matter how bad the world gets He will still dwell among His people to give them everything they need for their salvation. No leader, no matter how corrupt they are, can take away the victory that Christ has secured for each one of us! No army can take away the cross of Christ and all of its fruits. The righteous indeed live by faith, faith in the Son of God who reigns over heaven and earth for all eternity! Whatever it may be Lord, we pray that Your will be done!


