### An explanation of the Nicene Creed By Pastor Mundinger

We Believe....

Starting this month, we are going to take a look at what the Nicene Creed actually says. It's important to know the words which we confess every Sunday. One problem (if you can call it that) that some people have with the Nicene Creed compared to the Apostles Creed is the use of language and phrases that are a bit foreign to us. How often have you used the word "begotten" in your everyday life? I can say for certain that I have never used that phrase outside of confessing the creed in church on Sundays. So let's take a look at what these bishops of old have written as a confession for the church of all ages.

"I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible."

Just like the Apostles Creed, the Nicene Creed starts in a very personal way. In the Greek, Latin, and the English the creed begins with "I believe". When we recite the creed every Sunday, we are all making an individual confession of faith. The creed is both spoken to God and to one another, that we confess to our own brothers and sisters in Christ that we all share and believe in the one true faith. Our confession is the same as the person next to us. While we have all sorts of differences with our fellow Christians in the pews, we all have one thing in common; the one true faith which we confess.

At the heart of this confession is our faith in the One true God. Everything else in the creed flows from this one phrase. To confess the one God is to confess the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, three in one. What this exactly means will be hashed out later in the creeds as the authors dissect the Holy Trinity from what has been revealed to us in Scripture. Of course Scripture tells us that there is but one God. Moses confesses this in Deuteronomy 6:4 when he says to the people of Israel, "*Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.*". Jesus reaffirms this statement in the Gospel of Mark, "*Jesus replied, 'This is the most important: 'Hear O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is One.*"" There are not three Gods but One. Arius and his followers (whom the Nicene Creed was written to combat) would certainly agree with this opening statement but that would be the extent of their agreement. They would believe that God the Father is the One true God, but Jesus Christ to them is subordinate to the Father in every way meaning that He is lesser and therefore not the One true God. But again, to confess the One true God means that we confess Father, Son and Holy Spirit to be God, equal to one another. No person



of the Trinity is greater or lesser than the others. This will be covered later in the creed.

First up in the Creed is God the Father. We confess Him who is our Heavenly Father who is Almighty and made all things. We know from our study in the Gospel of John for the past few weeks that Jesus speaks of God as His Father. He also speaks of God being our own Father when He invites us to pray the prayer that he taught his disciples. This is what Martin Luther has to say about confessing God the Father to be our own Father. "With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father."

The Father is our own Father through Jesus Christ, and He has made all things. He has created that which is visible to our naked eyes (all that is around us in the world that has material form) along with all that we cannot see with our own eyes (Everything in the spiritual realm such as angels, demons). This confession seems like a no brainer. Who in their right mind would confess something different? There were different heretical sects in the beginning of the church which believed that God created the spiritual realm, but a lesser God (often called the Demiurge) formed all the world and everything in it with evil and corrupted matter. The Demiurge did not create the evil matter, he just used it to form the world. The two big sects who believed this were the Gnostics and Marcionites. The Mormons also believe that God did not create the matter for the Earth but rather formed pre-existing matter like a potter. Both these views are contrary to what Scripture says concerning creation and they are contrary to what we confess in the Nicene Creed. Listen to the words of the Apostle Paul as he speaks the truth of creation to the church at Colossae, "For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him."
