We Believe....

An explanation of the Nicene Creed By Pastor Mundinger

For us men and for our salvation came down from heaven

The next section deals with the salvation of mankind, the very reason Christ came in the flesh in his incarnation. The church has always said that to be a Christian one must believe in the incarnation, the virgin birth, the death of Christ, his resurrection, his ascension, and his final coming on the last day. These things that are listed out in the creed are not optional, we must believe them, for this is God's own salvific plan for us sinners.

"....and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end."

The first truth that we confess is the virgin birth. There are many

churches out there that allow their members to believe or flat out teach that the virgin birth did not happen. Scientifically speaking it is impossible for such an event to occur without divine intervention. Logically, (at least according to human standards) it makes more sense that Jesus was born just like everyone else in the world. But as Paul rightfully says, "Do not deceive yourselves. If any of you think you are wise by the standards of this age, you should become "fools" so that you may become wise." While the world may think believing in the virgin birth is foolish, so be it. Let them call us fools, for in our "foolishness" we are truly wise because the Holy Spirit has revealed

to us the truths of scripture.

First off, It is necessary to believe that the virgin birth is a real event because this is what Scripture tells us happened. This is what God has revealed to us in his Holy Word and that is enough for us. To say otherwise makes God a liar. Second, Jesus had to be born of our flesh in order to redeem our flesh. The author of Hebrews speaks of this matter when he writes, "Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted."

In order to be born of our flesh he had to be born of women, as we all are. To be fully human he had to be born like the rest of humanity so that he could redeem all of humanity. But unlike us, who are born in sin, Jesus has no sin in Him. This is because he is born differently than us in respect to His father. He had no earthly father (biological father) thus the spread of sin to father and child did not occur as it did for all of us. This is essential if Jesus is to be the perfect spotless sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. He needs to be born of the virgin Mary; this is God's plan for us. In order to be the redeemer of the world he needs to come in the flesh, but sinless flesh. If the virgin birth did not occur, then Jesus' sacrifice and death is useless and inefficient for how can a sinful being make propitiations for the sins of the world. Jesus had to be born of a virgin, conceived by the Holy Spirit so that no sin would touch his flesh.

And lastly, this is what the church has taught since the very beginning. Scripture clearly speaks of the virgin birth, there is no dispute here. Some claim that the virgin birth was a later invention by the church, that they adopted other cultures' mythology centuries after the fact. So what did the early church believe when it came to virgin birth? They believed it, end of story. Here are a few church fathers who clearly show that the church believed in the virgin birth early on.

"He was truly born of a virgin" Ignatius of Antioch 35-117 A.D.

"Christ Jesus, the Son of God, because of His surpassing love towards his creation, humbled himself to be born of the virgin. Thereby, He united man through Himself to God." Irenaeus 115-202AD

"Jesus, whom of the lightning flash of Divinity the virgin bore." Clement of Alexandria 150-215AD

What a joy it is for us to confess, along with the whole Christian church, the virgin birth of our Lord and all that it means for us sinners! Jesus shares our flesh because he was born of woman but remains spotless and perfect because his Father is God. Let us thank our Father for sending His Son in such a way that defies human expectation and by doing so His son redeems our flesh and takes away the sin of the world!





"Kingdom people produce KINGDOM FRUIT" was the theme of our *LWML Sunday* this October. "The kingdom of God will be ... given to a people producing its fruits." (Matthew 21:43) After church we shared fellowship, cake, and Mission Grants, both National LWML and California – Hawaii – Nevada LWML. We also shared information posters for the LWML CNH Mission Grants that remain to be funded. Thank you for your generous Mite giving the FIRST SUNDAY of each month.

At convention, every two years we select mission grants for the new biennium. The Covid-19 pandemic has taken its toll on funding our CNH Mission Grants for 2020-2021. Of those twenty-two grants totaling \$124,000, we have just this month funded #10. That adds up to \$63,925 in grants funded over 19 months. The remaining 12 Mission Grants total \$60,075, and we have 5 months remaining! We can use your help!

For every Mite \$1 give, 50 cents fund our CNH Mission Grants, 25 cents fund the LWML CNH General Fund (providing conventions, workshops, retreats, and scholarships, and overhead expenses), and 25 cents fund National LWML Mission Grants (28 Mission Grants totaling \$2,150,000 selected at the June 2021 convention in Lexington Kentucky).


