"Truth is in the eye of the sues, is a witness to the beholder" is truth for many world of what truth, espethey determine what is true. Another way to put it is: "You have your truth and I have mine." Truth is in the eyes of the beholder when we're dealing personal preferences, like and dislikes, opinions. and judgments, but not when it comes to facts and certainly not when it comes to the Word of God.

I wrote in recent newsletter articles that Christians should be standing on the truth of God's Word even when dealing with the social issues of our day. As implied in those articles, even Christians can fall into the trap of defining truth by personal experience, popular memes, politics, and political correctness even when such "truth" is contradicted by fact and reason. For example, some Christians have taken the up slogan "Hands up, Don't shoot" as gospel truth even though the Ferguson grand jury testimonies indicate that the victim did not utter that phrase nor did he put his hands up in surrender. As Christians, our stand on issues, including social is-

people; they believe that cially the truth of Scripture, means to us.

> We can debate social issues which Scripture does not directly address, but when it comes to damnation and salvation, it is not we sinners who have the final word but God, against whom we have sinned and



before whom we stand guilty and deserving of eternal damnation.

We might say things like, "I can't believe that a loving God would condemn people to hell as long as they try their best;" God's Word says, All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23) and the wages of sin is death (Romans 6:23a). In fact, all are conceived and born sinful (Psalm 51:5) and no one can plead "Not guilty" before God on the basis of his own goodness or offer as mitigating factors ignorance, intention, effort, or anything else. God gives salvation solely on the ba-



sis of His grace through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ, who bought our forgiveness and salvation with His guilty plea and suffering on the cross in our place: ⁸For by grace vou have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, ⁹not a result of works, so that no may boast. one (Ephesians 2:8-9)

God does love us. Jesus says in the passage we know and love: For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. (John 3;16). The is the Gospel; there is no other. Jesus goes on to say, For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. (John 3:17) This is the Gospel truth about how we are saved. Jesus says that He is the way, the truth, and the life, and no one comes to the Father except through [Him]. (John 14:6) Jesus

Christ crucified is it. No matter how much we might wish it were otherwise, there is no other way. no other savior: There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (St. Peter in Acts 4:12) Whoever believes in Him is not condemned. but whoever does not believe is condemned already. because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. (John 3:18).

When it comes to our salvation from sin and eternal death, the truth of the One who beholds us in grace and mercy on account of His Son, Jesus Christ, is the only truth that counts.⁴

PARKING LOT UPDATE JANUARY 2015

At the January Voters meeting the plan presented by the parking lot committee to resurface the parking lot was approved. The work will not be done until any threat of winter weather is past and the ground is dry.

The committee has continued to meet and has had discussions with the contractor regarding drainage, ADA requirements, concrete curbs around tree planters, additional car stops etc. There were a number of issues not included in the original estimate. The curbing would add \$30 per lineal foot - estimated cost of curbing around current planting areas and new ones as planned is \$5,700, additional car stops as needed- \$30 each, encroachment permit from the City of Concord \$1,275, possible ADA option - \$2,500. Other costs -\$1,500.

We are still waiting for the removal of the trees by PG & E.

As of December 31, 2014 the restricted fund for the parking lot was approximately \$39,000, other restricted funds that are to be used approximately \$25,000 for an approximate total of \$64,000. We are happy to report an increase in the available amount, the support for the project is very much appreciated. The Council is investigating additional financing.
