

## The Objective Truth of Christmas



our Christmas celebration; they cannot, however, rob us of God's blessings of Christmas because though our emotions can diminish our appreciation and enjoyment of Christmas, God's blessings of Christmas are not dependent on how we feel. Our celebration may be subjective, but what is celebrated at Christmas, that is, the birth of the Savior, Jesus Christ, is objective. Feelings, doubts, or circumstances do not and cannot undo history, that 2000 years ago in Bethlehem, in the fullness of time, God sent forth His Son who came into human history to save us from sin (Gal.4:4), which is summarized beautifully in the Second Article of the Nicene Creed:

The Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven



and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And he will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.

The objective truth of Christmas, independent of our emotions, is that God has come to us in the flesh in Jesus, who is Emmanuel, "God with us," to reconcile us to Himself. Jesus bridged the eternal separation between God and man caused by sin, reestablishing peace and fellowship between God and man by His atoning sacrifice on the cross.

Nothing can erase the divine, historical, and objective reality of Jesus' incarnation, birth, crucifixion, resurrection, ascension; nothing will deter Him from returning to raise us to life in the resurrection. The blessings — namely forgiveness of sins and life in resurrection as well as His abiding grace and mercy now — that result from all that Jesus has done and continues through the means of grace as Emmanuel, "God with us" transcend feelings and circumstances.

"Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11). \$\P\$
