Leaven or Lump?...

Which are you? Which are you living as?

Paul uses the metaphor of "leaven" in Galatians 5 and 1Corinthians 5; he re-

minds us in each case that "a little leaven leavens the whole lump."

In Galatians 5:9,
"leaven" refers to the
false and spiritually
fatal doctrine that perverted the Gospel
among the Galatian
Christians. A faction
was insisting that to be

part of God's people (i.e., salvation), Gentile Christians not only trust Jesus as Savior but also observe Judaic practices, particularly circumcision; this was a "gospel" condemned by Paul and contrary to the true Gospel that Paul preached, which was (and is) the Gospel of salvation by God's grace through faith on account of Christ crucified and risen.

In 1Corinthians 5:6, "leaven" refers to the cancerous influence of immorality among the Corinthian Christians, specifically occasioned by the incestuous conduct of a man in the church in Corinth.

The Galatian Church was the "lump" in danger of being leavened by the

leaven of false doctrine; the Corinthian Church was the "lump" in danger of being leavened by the leaven of immorality. Unchecked, undeterred, but allowed to fester, false doctrine and immorality,

> however seemingly insignificant or small at first, will pervert the Gospel and corrupt the people of God.

We, the people of God through baptism and faith in Christ, can act like either leaven or lump.

As Christians, we are a new creation in Christ (2Corinthians 5:17). We have the Holy Spirit (John 20:22; 1Thessalonians 4:8; 2Timothy 1:14). All by God's grace (Romans 3:23-25; Ephesians 2:8-9). And as God's redeemed people by grace through faith in Jesus as Savior, we are called to be the leaven that leavens and influences our world with God's Word of both Law and Gospel and by our Christian conduct.

But sinners that we are — our sinful nature fights against our new nature's desire to do the will of God (Romans 7:15-25) — often we become like the lump that is leavened by the world and influenced by the world's philosophy, theology, and moral relativism.

Paul writes in Ephesians: ²²...Put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, ²³ and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness (Eph 4:22-24). This we do by using the means of grace and daily repenting (confessing sins and receiving God's forgiveness) and relying on God's grace by God's grace working in us through the Gospel.

Even a little false doctrine leavens; so does even a little immorality. Unless excised, each can and will pervert the Gospel and corrupt the people of God.

Conversely, we, the people of God, can leaven the world. The good works we do out of faith and by faith leaven those around us. What we do may seem small, but God can and will bless what we do in His name. The Word of God we speak may seem to us insignificant and to the world foolish, but that Word is the power of God that accomplishes the will of God. When we share with people the Gospel of Christ crucified for their sins, we leaven, influence, and sow the seed that is the power to bring sinners to faith in Christ.

You are leaven called to leaven and influence the world with the Word of God in word and deed. Are you living as leaven or lump?



Holy Cross Day

On September 14, many churches observe a festival variously called Exaltation of the Cross, Feast of the Glorious Cross, Triumph of the Cross or Holy Cross Day.

According to legend, St. Helena, mother of Roman Emperor Constantine, while on pilgrimage to Jerusalem in 326, discovered the actual cross on which Jesus had been crucified. Although portions were taken to Rome and Constantinople, part was kept at the discovery site.

By order of Helena and Constantine, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher was built and dedicated there on September 13, 335. The following day, the portion of what was called the True Cross was brought outside so worshipers could pray before it.

While Good Friday commemorates Jesus' crucifixion, Holy Cross Day focuses on the cross itself as an instrument of cruel death, which God transformed into the means of eternal life.
