

We Believe.... An explanation of the Nicene Creed By Pastor Mundinger

From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.


To be Christian one must confess that Christ will come again someday to raise the dead from their tombs, gather God's saints, and bring judgment to the world. Christ gave us a promise that that day will come, and it will be a glorious day for all of God's faithful. It will be on this day where we will experience the full glory of our Savior and the full gory of all his promises. We will finally experience the new creation for which Jesus came to bring in His incarnation and won for us on the cross.

But this will also be a day of judgment for all of humanity. Sin cannot stand before a righteous God. All throughout scripture God has spoken to us through the prophets and through Christ Jesus that there is judgement to come for all. In the Middle Ages the judgment that is to come brought great terror to Christians. Just look at paintings done during this time period, and you will be able to peer into the theology of the Middle Ages. The fear that the average Christian felt for the last judgment was extremely severe.

Young Martin Luther was a product of this kind of thinking and fear when he lived as an Augustinian friar. One day he was asked, "Brother Martin, do you love God?" You know what he said? "Love God? You ask me if I love God? Sometimes I hate God. I see Christ as a consuming judge who is simply looking at me to evaluate me and to visit affliction upon me." To Luther and to the rest of the church in the west, there was no clear way to know that one was doing enough good works to extinguish the flame of God's wrath. In the end there was always this fear that we who are unrighteous could never pass the test of a righteous God and certain judgement awaited all of us who fail to measure to the righteous set forth from the Father.



Thanks be to God that it is not our own righteousness that stands before God, it is the righteousness of Christ which He so freely shares with us. This is how we can have confidence in the judgment that is to come, because in baptism we have been united with Christ, and he shares with us all his attributes. We are clothed in His righteousness and now the Father does not see us and our polluted garments, he sees Christ who has covered us. All this is as Luther put it, extra nos, which is a Latin phrase that means "outside of ourselves". There is nothing good in us sinners, our salvation is totally outside of ourselves. Our salvation is in Christ and His work! It does not come from within us, but outside of us in the one who stands before God perfect and blameless, pleading before the Father on our behalf with wounds He sustained on Golgotha.

The last day and the judgment that is to come should not strike terror in our hearts. As St. John puts it, "We have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world." The author of Hebrews writes, "Consequently, he is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them," and Paul has this to say in his letter to the Romans "Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us."

Dear friends, we need not look inside of us to our good works or our keeping of the law to find certainty. If that is our measure, then there is no real certainty and we are doomed come judgment day. Look outside of yourself (that is *extra nos*) to the One who suffered and died for you, to the one who has ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. Look to the one who is pleading for you in the holy of holies before the Father. He is your righteousness, He is your life, and He is your salvation.


