


Baptism Saves! By Pastor Mundinger

As we continue our discussion of the doctrine of Baptism one question always seems to keep popping up. How can baptism save? This is a valid question for we Lutherans have been taught since the very beginning the three solas: "Grace alone", "Faith alone", and "Scripture alone". We rightfully understand that it is by grace through faith that we are saved, not through any of our own works. The Apostle Paul is very clear on this point throughout his various epistles. No work from ourselves can save us. There is nothing we can offer to the table that will help us achieve eternal life, it is all on account of the work of Christ and Him alone.

The thing to remember, though, is that Baptism is not a human work that we do to earn salvation. If baptism was merely an act of obedience, then of course it cannot save us. Lutherans rightfully believe that Baptism saves because it delivers Christ to us. That is, Baptism takes the grace of God earned by Jesus at the cross and applies that grace to the individual. This is why the Apostle Peter can confidently declare to us, "Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of

Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 3:21

Baptism isn't just some ordinary washing that removes dirt and filth. Baptism removes sin from us. It offers forgiveness of sins and where there is forgiveness of sins there is salvation. Peter also speaks of the benefits of baptism in the book of Acts when he says, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38. Those who turn from their wicked ways and are baptized will have their sins washed away, there will be forgiveness, and they are promised the Holy Spirit. This is the same Holy Spirit

which Christ promises the disciples who will create and sustain faith in their hearts which clings to Christ and his work on the cross. Peter is very clear that Baptism gives you these gifts, forgiveness, and the Holy Spirit. Of course, only God can grant us these things.

Paul also speaks of the pouring out of the Holy Spirit in his letter to Titus, "He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. Titus 3:5-7

Baptism is a means which God acts for us. It is a way that he brings to us His most precious grace and mercy that Christ won for us on the cross. How can Baptism save? Because it is God working his salvation for us through the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, that is through the forgiveness of sins and the giving of the Holy Spirit. Scripture is very clear that God is working through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

Of course, I have heard some say, "Faith comes through the Word of God only." and this is a true statement. Faith comes through hearing after all, according to Paul. The thing is Baptism is way more than just pouring water on someone. If that were the case then it would be just a washing for the removal of dirt. We Lutherans believe that Baptism is water combined with the Word of God. When the Pastor speaks the words which our Lord gave us, "I baptize you in the name of Father, Son and Holy Spirit." it is actually God's Word which is being spoken much like in the Words of Institution, absolution, reading from Holy Scripture, and the sermon.

God works through his Word that is attached to the physical element of water to wash our sins, forgive us, and give us his Holy Spirit. You do not receive these things because of the pastor or your own will, but rather because it is God speaking and working His grace for you. Again, if Baptism was a work of our own doing then it could not offer us forgiveness and the Holy Spirit, and it certainly couldn't save us. I thank the Lord that this is not the case and that his faithful servants, Peter and Paul, have declared to us the great and wonderful reality that in the waters of Holy Baptism our Lord forgives us our sins and pours out on us the Holy Spirit who creates and sustains faith in our hearts that clings to Christ and all his works for our salvation. Baptism now saves you!

Tuesday, August 30th, **Britt Odemba, LCMS Missionary from Kenya,** joined us for a presentation on her work with Project 24, a children's boarding facility program initiated by the LCMS and the ELCK, Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya. Britt has been serving in Kenya for ten years. This past year she has been supervising Project 24, now comprised of eight locations, mostly in western Kenya. There are 200-300 students she personally visits







sponsors. About one hundred of the students have individual sponsors (primarily in the US), some have group sponsors, and the remainder are sponsored from Project 24's budget.

Britt's slide presentation and the information she shared, gave us a taste of the mission field. Missionary Gary Theis at Mission Central in Iowa is firm in pronouncing "We are all missionaries." We may not walk the roads of Kenya, but prayers and financial support of our LCMS missionaries make us an important part of the mission field.

DID YOU KNOW???.....

That you can give to Holy Cross by using your IRA account? You can make a "qualified charitable distribution" (QCD) directly to Holy Cross from your IRA, and we already have a few members doing this! With a QCD a check goes directly from your IRA to Holy Cross, never passing through your hands and this distribution is excluded from your taxable income.

This method is a great way to satisfy the required minimum distribution (RMD) rule which is either 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ or 72 depending on your birthdate. If you have an IRA, are at least 70 $\frac{1}{2}$, and would like to consider giving an offering this way, please let me know. I encourage you to check with your financial advisor or accountant too. Hot August for LWML CNH Mites!

Indeed, August was HOT... our LWML faithful Mite givers are hot! The mighty Mites have funded Mission Grant #3, Fort Wayne Theological Seminary Food Co-op - \$2,500, Fort Wayne, Indiana. (Mission Grants #1 and #2 were funded in June-July.) The Co-op is vital to the livelihood of many seminary students, providing 80-85% of the family's food and household needs at no cost. How wonderful is God's timing to fund this grant just as the new fall school year is starting. We are now collecting mites to fund Mission Grant #4. Hmong Lent Family Retreat — \$13,000 for the Hmong Outreach of Redeemer Lutheran, Fresno & St. Paul Lutheran, Merced, California.

When the Hmong people sought refuge in the USA after the Vietnam war, they brought their cultural tradition of

spirit worship with them.
They have a strong family
unit bonding, often 3
generations live in the same
house. The Hmong outreach
ministry has been reaching
out to the Hmong communities in various ways over the
last 6 years. One of the ways



has been through the LWML CNH District retreats. Last August 23 Hmong ladies and youth attended the retreat. The benefits of the retreats are reaching both the churched and unchurched with

knowledge of Jesus. The Hmong Outreach ministry would like to have a Lenten family retreat for an in-depth program Maundy Thursday through Easter Sunday. Hmong families will get a chance to know Jesus better through the lens of the Lenten Season. They will learn Jesus's journey and purpose of traveling to Jerusalem to die for the world as well as His resurrection at that First Easter. Non-believers, often family members will hear testimonies in their native language of how Jesus has blessed them in their daily lives since becoming believers. The funds will be used to offset the cost of the retreat facilities, Lenten devotionals and pamphlets.



Holy Cross collected \$679 in Mites during June, July, and August, with 50% going to LWML CNH Mission Grants, 25% to LWML CNH General Fund, and 25% to LWML (national) Mission Grants. See the poster in the Parish Hall for funding and payment of the LWML Mission Grants.








What happen to our old freezer? After no one at Holy Cross was interested, I posted it, for free, on Facebook Marketplace & Nextdoor. After a couple failed attempts (due to no way to transport it), a gal named Linda contacted me. She works with Jack Fliehmann, who provides basic needs (food, clothing, protection, & the Word) to 50-60+ of our homeless neighbors every day. She arranged for their Pastor to come pick it up. Here was her text to me afterwards: "Yes we took the freezer. A few friends went & found it and brought it to me. I was going to message you & thank you, but I haven't had a chance. They got the big beast into my house haha & she's working just fine, thank you, thank you, thank you!".

On a related note, there were 3-4 hotel pans of food & bread left from Scott Morfeld's memorial reception. The family asked us (Holy Cross) to care for the leftovers. Saturday morning I contacted Linda & asked if they could use it. "YES!" she said. Mike & I delivered it to her home, where she told us it came at just the right time! Jack is busy caring for his wife who is trying to figure out why she is having seizures (he also cares for his elderly mother who lives in Oakland)— so they are short handed.
