

## News Release: LWML CNH Mission Grants

 Mission Grant #4, Hmong Lent Family Retreat – \$13,000, Redeemer Lutheran, Fresno & St. Paul, Merced, California has been fully funded!

We are now working on Mission Grant #5. Outreach Ministry to Homeless - \$8,000, Bridging Initiatives International and Town and Country Lutheran, Sacramento, California

This ministry partners with Mercy Holistic Ministry's shower outreach by providing counseling (mental health, rehab) and connecting with other services for the homeless (shelters and housing). After the shower session, each individual is seen by a caring individual working with Bridging Initiatives. During these one-on-one sessions the life-changing gospel of Jesus is shared. The grant funds are for: brochures, transportation, gift cards, temporary motel vouchers, educational materials, food, blankets, and clothes.

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." - 1 Thessalonians 5:18

## **Holy Cross Thanksgiving Dinner**



### Cheryl's Hot Reuben Dip by Cheryl Syrovatka

1 package (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

½ cup sour cream

2 Tablespoons ketchup

½ pound deli corned beef, finely chopped

1 cup sauerkraut, chopped, rinsed and drained

1 cup shredded Swiss cheese

2 Tablespoons finely chopped onion

Snack crackers or rye bread



In a small mixing bowl, beat cream cheese, sour cream and ketchup until smooth. Stir in the corned beef, sauerkraut, Swiss cheese and onion until blended. Transfer to a greased 1-qt baking dish. Cover & bake in a 375 degree oven for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake 5 minutes longer or until bubbly. Serve warm with bread or crackers. Yield: 3 cups
