Keeping the Silence by Pastor Mundinger

Our lives here on earth are full of noise, they are quite busy. I find it difficult to find a space of quietness even during my daily routines. There is always something distracting me; yet in this season of Lent we are called to be in quiet devotion at times. Even Jesus Himself found time to step away for prayer with His Heavenly Father.

You may notice every year during this season that the mood at church seems to change. Things seem a lot darker. Even our music seems to be darker and less joyous than it was when we celebrated the Transfiguration of our Lord. This is, of course, on purpose since the season of Lent is a season of reflection and meditation on the passion of our Lord and this calls for quietness at times. It calls for meditation away from the usually distracting

noises of our everyday lives, that we would give it the proper attention it is due.

On the following page is an excerpt from an article in the Lutheran Witness by Dr. Gregory J. Wismar about keeping a holy Lent. In it he gives us ways to be keepers of the silence in our daily lives during the season of Lent.



"What is the holiest season of the Church Year?

Perhaps that seems an inappropriate question. After all, each season in the annual cycle we observe has its distinct spiritual character. There is the anticipation of Advent, the glorious rejoicing of Christmas, the exuberant triumph of Easter, and the resounding power of Pentecost. But what season invites us more than any other to a repentant reflecting, to a changing of the patterns of our lives, to a new dimension of devotion? That season is Lent, the period of preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Day. Each year on Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, the liturgy of the Church calls us to begin "a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection," when "our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The words used in the Ash Wednesday rite of the *Lutheran Service Book Agenda* also remind us that "from ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, selfdenial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope."

Each of the seasons of the church year is observed and celebrated, but Lent, and only Lent, is "kept." The holy season of Lent invites us to be "keepers"—the people of God who keep the fast, keep the silence, and keep the focus throughout this singular season.....

.......Another spiritual dynamic of Lent is that it is a time to *keep the silence* in reflection and devotion. The language of Lent is purposefully quieted. The word *alleluia* is not used as an expression of praise in Lent. Our vocal and instrumental music is reflective and subdued. Purple, the liturgical color customarily appointed for Lent, is the "quietest" of the colors used throughout the church year and is associated with penitence and sorrow.

In many churches, the crosses, crucifixes, and other religious artwork is "veiled"—covered with a transparent cloth throughout the 40 days to mute their brilliance and to add a solemn tone to the worship space. In some places, families also cover religious paintings and wall hangings in their homes.

Times of silence for personal reflection and prayer before individual or family devotions have special meaning in Lent. The words of one of the great Lutheran hymns of Lent serve as a call to an extra measure of devotion and prayer: "Jesus, I will ponder now / On Your holy Passion; / With Your Spirit me endow / For such meditation" (LSB 440,).

Today, establishing a proper setting for such reflection in our fast-paced and noisy world may take extra determination. Finding that place and observing that time, however, is another central component of the discipline of the holy season of Lent and is more than worth the effort.

Although much devotional material for the Lenten season exists, one of the best—and readily available— sources of such material is the corpus of Lenten hymns in Lutheran hymnals. Each hymn contains meaningful sacred lyrics from across the history of Christian poetic expression—ready to be rediscovered and taken to heart again and again, whether as part of keeping the silence or in concert with others.



21) by creating:

- Meaningful worship opportunities for members and guests
 - Christian growth and unity through Bible study
- The sharing of Christ with family, community, and the world
 - Service to our community, including those less fortunate
 - Internal and external fellowship opportunities

Vision Discussion

- Monthly prayer/praise sessions whole congregation joins together.
- More joint church activities/collaborative events
- Community service events (e.g. foodbank) volunteers wear church T shirts.
- Care Team help members with elder care, giving them a break for some self-time. Visit members in care facilities, read scriptures to them.
- Go out and invite people (friends, family neighbors) to church once a month (publish in bulletin)
- Member drive invite past members to return to our church (maybe combine with 5th Sunday meal)
- Men's bible study (5-minute bible study program)
- Youth education assistance (reading & math training to help kids negatively impacted by COVID)
- New member/visitor follow-up/outreach program
- Research some type of veteran's program/approach.
- Develop program/workshop on how to start spiritual conversations.
- Team Jesus work with circuit or district to create merchandise/apparel.
- Give Holy Cross coffee cups (sippy cups for kids) to visitors/new members (maybe with a verse), keep us on their minds. Welcome packages. MLBG beer mugs?
- Door hanging materials/mailers let people in the neighborhood know we are here and our church hours.
- Member ride program for those who cannot attend (member pickup, Uber ride, etc.)
- Reach out to cities who are losing Lutheran churches (print an invitation and pass out or mail, get old church directories)
- Reach out to confirmed youth who are no longer attending our church.
- Invitation Sunday invite other members from closed churches to join us for service and a meal.
- Make our live stream services known to remote, homebound or underserved persons.
- Spanish service (or other language)
- Increase our social media exposure (establish an Instagram account)
- Grief counseling group at church but for entire community (Pay a trained group to lead, but we host)
- Adopt (in fellowship) a military Chaplain.
- Sponsor an international church or fund someone on a mission.
- Veterans Pastor join one of their monthly meetings as a guest speaker.
- Xmas an all-music service and invite the community (maybe in public location)
- Joint volunteer activities with other Lutheran churches (also joint services)
- Youth group sing at train station and pass out church fliers.
- Women's shelter volunteer and care
- Support TAY young persons who have aged out of foster care.

Wow! This is like a Las Vegas buffet. Where do we start? Many raw ideas and not all will fit on our plate. For our next step the Vision Committee is reviewing and discussing so that we can investigate and develop a few of the ideas to serve our mission. And you are invited to this next step by joining in the Vision Committee meeting (Zoom call) each first Saturday morning at 9:00. Another way is to share the ideas that come to when reading the list - more details and your how-to ideas to share.

We have Great News and gifts to share! Let's work together on how we will do it.
