He's Risen! St. Paul encourages Christians to pray and to give thanks "2for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. 3This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, 4who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth."

To that end, printed below is the prayer offered by Dr. R. Albert Mohler, Jr., President of The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary during the seminary's chapel service on March 1, 2016. Although the prayer was offered during the "Super Tuesday" caucuses/primaries, the substance of His pray is applicable at all times:

Almighty Father, we do come before you aware of the fact that government is not an accident nor is it our invention, but rather it is your gift to us in the very structures of creation as you have given us — that which will lead to righteousness and justice and human flourishing. We understand that you have created government and given it to us, to your human creatures, in order to restrain evil and uphold that which is good.

And Father, even as we recognize that here in our own state, with the caucus and around the country, with so many primaries and political events today, Father, we mean to pray in a way that is honoring to you. Father, you have set forth in Scripture a model of the kind of leaders we should aspire to have, and the kind of leadership that we should be—as a people aspiring to be—in order that leaders who uphold righteousness and justice would emerge from us. So we pray this day that you will bless this people. And with a horizon far beyond what takes place today, but with today very much on our minds, Father we pray that you will give us leaders, eventually a president of the United States, who will uphold righteousness and do justice, whose personal character will befit the office, and whose convictions and understanding will lead to flourishing amongst this people.

Father, we pray for the sanctity of human life to be upheld. We pray for the dignity and sanctity of every single human life to be valued. Father, we pray for the goods you have given us to be honored. And Father, we pray for the least of these among us to be protected. And Father, we pray for a government that we acknowledge we do not deserve, but we pray this in confidence that it is not we who rule, but you, and we commit this to you as your thankful people. In Christ's name we pray, Amen."

Every presidential election is consequential, this year's being no different. Including the current vacancy on the U.S. Supreme Court — and depending on whether a

justice is nominated and confirmed before the start of the next Presidential term in January 2017 — the next president likely will have an opportunity to nominate 3-4 new Supreme Justices, which means that his/her policies, ideology, worldview will influence this country far beyond his/her presidential term(s).

Most of are passionate about politics, but whether we align ourselves with one of the two main parties or count ourselves among the Libertarians or Independents — and whoever wins the White House in this election — as Christians, we give thanks to God from whom all blessings flow, including the gift of government, and whether our candidates wins or loses, we pray for our leaders and thank God that He is Lord of the nations and that He is in control.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Holy Cross,



The Nantucket Restaurant located at 601 Port Street Crocket CA 94525 This is a Sea Food restaurant hidden under the Carquinez Bridge and is a little difficult to find. They serve delicious seafood in a friendly atmosphere. They have Italian Style Soup prepared daily with fresh crab. prawns, clams, scallops in a stew with tomatoes garlic and herbs. They also have clam chowder and a host of other seafood, all reasonably priced. I understand the Fish and Chips are the best in the bay area.
