Stereotypes may or may not have basis in reality; even where there is, it is often tenuous at best.

Mike Vacarro, New York Post's chief sports writer, suggested in his recent article, "Ryan Lochte Is Everything the World Hates About Americans," that the "Ugly American" stereotype abroad is alive and well in 2016 thanks to Ryan Lochte and his three teammates who lied about being robbed in Rio. Vacarro relates how his colleagues stereotype the "Ugly American" as having a sense of entitlement, however subtle; a feeling of superiority, however unintended.

Sometimes, as I've traveled overseas, Vacarro writes, I've been troubled by that notion, of the assumption of the Ugly American. I've thought it a cartoon, a caricature, whose time was surely over. And then, sometimes, you see someone like Ryan Lochte open his mouth. And when you hear what comes tumbling out, it all makes perfect sense. The world — nonChristians — often stereotypes Christians as having a "holier-than-thou" air of superiority, hypocrites who often don't practice what they/we preach.

Whether we agree with the stereotype of Americans, the stereotype of Christians has basis in fact: we don't always practice what we preach and, in fact, we can't. No matter how determined we might be to obey God — assuming we want to, which we often don't — we do fail to practice what we preach and will do so till the day we die. And sometimes perhaps in our zeal to proclaim the Word of God, especially the Law, we forget to do so in a humble, compassionate, and winsome manner.

Christians are neither perfect nor better than anyone else and we don't, and certainly shouldn't, claim to be. We are sinners just like everyone else. Difference between Christians and nonbelievers is faith in Christ. Christians, through faith in Christ, are forgiven sinners, declared righteous and not guilty by God on account of Jesus Christ Whom He judged guilty in place of all sinners. By His grace, we accept the gift of forgiveness and salvation. This doesn't make us better than anyone else; it makes us better off for now and for eternity.

Jesus warned that we, who bear His name, would be hated by the world because it hates Him. The world also hates Jesus' Word that we believe, trust, confess, and profess, because it accuses sinners, holds sinners accountable, condemns sinners, and points sinners to Him as the way, the truth, and the life.

The world does not need any reason to hate or accuse Christians other than that we claim Jesus to be the Son of God and the only Savior and we teach, confess, and stand on Scripture as the inerrant, infallible Word of God that is at odds with the wisdom of the world.

But let's not give the world cause to cling to the stereotypes of Christians by perpetuating those stereotypes with our words or actions. Rather, we admit that we are sinners, no better than anyone one, though we are better off because of faith in Christ as Savior and Lord. And when we fail to love God above else and to love our neighbors — believers and unbelievers alike — as we love ourselves, we admit and confess our sins, ask for forgiveness from God and from those whom we sinned against, and look to Jesus and point others to Him as Son of God who loves with divine, undeserved, and unconditional love that forgives, restores, and renews.
