From the Pastor...

Unlocking Change

We are experiencing a time of great change here at Holy Cross. Two of those changes are <u>Wade Parlier will be retiring</u> as our Minister of Music next month, and we will be going to a <u>One Worship Service Summer Schedule</u> with one worship time at 10AM. The Bible reminds us that for everything there is a season, and seasons must change in order for life to bloom, grow, and bear fruit. I find it interesting that the entire universe is in a constant state of change. Even the planet we live on is in a state of constant change. Did you know that the Earth's continents, which continue to shift and move, have been in their current configuration (what you'd see on a map) for LESS THAN one tenth of one percent of the Earth's history? One of the underlying truths of the universe is that *all things are in a constant state of change*.

Imagine a world without change. Babies would never grow into the people they are becoming (and let's not get started on a world without diaper changes – yuck). If our very lungs didn't change several times a day we would die, because all living things must inhale and exhale. Change is hard, but it is an integral part of life that allows us to enter into new seasons where life is renewed, and beauty takes on a richer tapestry of color.

He brings them a peace that runs deeper that the changes they are experiencing. He brings them a peace that runs deeper than their fears. Joey Wagoner called the meeting to order: 7:03 p.m.

Devotions: Mike Wootton

Special Guest: Wade Parlier announced that after much thought, consideration and prayer, he has decided to retire from music ministry. He advised council that nothing has forced him into this decision and he has been thinking about it for some time now. His retirement will be effective June 30, 2019 as the church starts a new year. Council expressed their sadness for his departure as well as appreciation for his 20+ years to the ministry at Holy Cross.

March Council minutes were approved

Committee Reports

Christian Ed - Cindy Dancoff reports Easter Egg Hunt is this Saturday. Agape Day Camp is Jul $28 - \text{Aug } 2^{\text{nd}}$. We need volunteers to help execute the camp and find people willing to house and feed the staff. VBS is dates are to be announced at a later time. We will do the 3 day VBS (Saturday – Monday) like last year.

Finance – Joey discussed in detail the financial reports from March as well as YTD that include the 1st Quarter results. In summary, the church is paying all its bills. However, based off budget through 3/31/19, the church is \$10,960.09 or 15% under needed giving. In addition, the church is under budget with expense by \$4598.79 or 7%. Usually our giving goes down during the summer months but our expense will relatively stay the same. Council members need to urge their committees to spend conservatively.

Property-All known repairs have been made. Will put out more straw on muddy and bald areas before the Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday.

Social Ministry/Fellowship- Relay for Life Fundraiser May 3 for Bunco Night. Pastor's Report-Pastor Chad reported he is extremely saddened to learn about Wade's retirement. Advises this may be a good opportunity to see how to transform the music ministry since the two paid positions are vacant. Church Services are set for Holy Week. There has been low attendance for the youth groups so he and the adult volunteers are meeting to brainstorm. Asking that everyone continues to pray for the church.

Old Business- Joey reports that the Roof Project is completed. Total spent was \$21,017 which is under budget. Raise the roof campaign was not as successful has we had hoped. Discussed doing more Stewardship campaigns to show the need to keep up with monthly expenses.

New Business – Discussed the direction of the Music Ministry. Since no mutual ministry committee exists, it was decided that per bylaws and constitution, Joey and Pastor Chad are to act as the mutual ministry. They are to come up with a job description for one paid position that will handle all the music ministry needs for the church. Council also discussed and decided to go with one worship service during the summer months starting June 2nd, 2019. Traditionally speaking, attendance goes down and this will encourage worshipers from both services to come together Service will have both contemporary and traditional music. Service will be at 10am for worship and a 9am adult Sunday school service.

Next Council Meeting May 19 at 7:30pm (moved due to Mother's Day)

The Risen Christ speaks a peace to us as we give thanks for over 20 years of Wade's ministry with us, as we have grown in our music and worship. I am so grateful to have served with him for the past nine years. He has been a valued and appreciated teammate, as we have sought to bring excellence to our worship here. Wade will be deeply missed, and I am saddened to be losing him as a part of our church staff. At the same time, I am grateful for the new season that lies ahead. It will be an adventure filled with turns and pitfalls, but it will also bring us to whatever new place God is calling us to.

The Risen Christ speaks peace to us as we make the change of moving to a summer schedule of one service at 10am. This will mean we ALL have to make adjustments that may not be easy. This change will give us an opportunity to have our entire congregation gathered together to worship the Risen Christ who is here each week to say, "peace be with you." This change will also give us the opportunity to more clearly see and "unlock" ourselves for the future God has in store for us.

As your Pastor, it is my hope to lead us through this time of change in a way that "unlocks" each of us to a new and enriched sense of God's grace in our lives. Please feel free to talk with me about these or any other changes we make as a congregation. May you always sense the voice of the Risen Christ, that runs deeper than any change that surrounds us, and says to us, "Peace be with you!"
