### From the Pastor...

### **Sunday Lift**

Have you heard about SUNDAY LIFT? No, it's not an app on your phone that will get you a ride like Uber. Sunday Lift is something new we are trying at 9:00 on Sunday mornings. It is a time for children, teenagers, and adults to come together. For many years most churches have separated folks by age group for an hour of education time called Sunday School. I have often wondered why it is we do that. Most people I ask will usually respond with something like, "we've always done it that way;" or "that's what they do in school." When we separate the generations from each other, I am convinced that we are missing out on a tremendous gift that comes from gathering folks of various ages.

I am convinced that gathering people of different generations energizes congregations. It empowers those who gather to invest in God, their faith, and the faith of others. This investment is mutual. It allows people of different generation to experience how people of different ages think differently. This allows younger participants to become "generationally literate," which will serve them as they enter into adulthood and must know how to relate to people who are older than them. It also allows older participants to experience the real gifts that those who come after them have, and help to feel more hopeful about the future. Faith is truly passed on again and again throughout the generations.

Another truth is that gathering generations together is Biblical. There are family meals like the Passover and various feasts in the Old Testament at which the stories of God and God's people were passed on. When it comes to our most sacred meal, holy communion, Paul in the New Testament says that he is "passing on what was given to him." That is what Sunday Lift is all about. We will be sharing the stories, faith, and experiences of God across generations.

Ministry Leaders: You are invited to prepare flyers with info about your ministry (church or community) to be added to the bags.

The Sunday Lift program is based on the four components by which the early church operated. Acts 2:42 says, "The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers" (CEB).

- 1. "the apostles' teaching": The apostles' studied the Scriptures to learn about God and grow in their faith. In Sunday LIFT: Studying God's Word Together, we learn from each other as we study God's word.
- 2. "the community": The apostles cared for each other and their community. In Sunday LIFT: Playing Together, we make time for fellowship by playing games, doing hobbies, enjoying other activities that are fun to do together.
- 3. "their shared meals": The apostles broke break together by sharing meals. In Sunday LIFT: Breaking Bread Together, we grow relationships around tables as we eat together.
- 4. "their prayers": The apostles worshipped God through prayer and praise. In Sunday LIFT: Praying Together, prayer is experienced through a simple worship experience. Each Sunday LIFT session begins with Gathering Together and then moves through the four components of the first church, with all parts connected by a common theme.

We will begin on Rally Day, September 8th at 9am, with food, fun, and more information about Sunday Lift. Our first official day of Sunday Lift will be Sunday, September 15th at 9am. All generations are invited (there will be a nursery provided for our littlest ones). I pray you will consider giving this new and exciting opportunity a try. May God bless us as we continue to share and grow faith!
