From the Pastor...

Eliminate the Offering?

Someone recently forwarded me an article written by a Pastor named Andrew entitled "Pastors: Let's Eliminate the Offering." Just from the title I thought, "What? That's crazy! What could this guy be thinking!" As I read further, I discovered how wrong I have been so often in my thinking about how, why, and what we give. I was surprised that the word "Offering" has a certain meaning in the modern world. When we "offer" something, we think of it as giving something that is "ours." For example, we offer wisdom, advice, possessions in a way that says, "This is MINE and I'm offering it to YOU." When we buy a car, we usually make an "offer." There's nothing wrong with this, however when we transfer this to a church "offering" setting, it does not jive with the Biblical understanding of offering.

In Deuteronomy 26:10 we find "'And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which you, O Lord, have given me.' And you shall set it down before the Lord your God and worship before the Lord your God." In Deuteronomy 16:17 "All shall give as they are able, according to the blessing of the Lord your God that he has given you." Did you catch the difference? The understanding of



giving to God is NOT from our own doing, but instead God and belongs to God. I believe this understanding of what we have changes

our relationship to all of our possessions. It inspires us to see that ALL is a gift from God, and ALL is grace and grace alone. It also helps us to see ourselves as temporary managers of these things during our limited mortal lifetime.




