


#### **Prayer for the First Wednesday in Advent**

# Readings

#### Reading: Isaiah 64:1-9

Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil to make your name known to your adversaries, and that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome things that we did not look for, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From of old no one has heard or perceived by the ear, no eye has seen a God besides you, who acts for those who wait for him. You meet him who joyfully works righteousness, those who remember you in your ways. Behold, you were angry, and we sinned; in our sins we have been a long time, and shall we be saved? We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. We all fade like a leaf. and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to take hold of you;

for you have hidden your face from us, and have made us melt in the hand of our iniquities. But now, O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.

Be not so terribly angry, O LORD, and remember not iniquity forever. Behold, please look, we are all your people.



The congregation's response may begin just as the leader's petition ends so that the word "Lord" is sung simultaneously by both leader and congregation.







# Soli Deo Gloria!

(To God alone be the glory.)





- 1st CANDLE (purple) THE PROPHECY CANDLE or CANDLE
  OF HOPE We can have hope because God is faithful and
  will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from
  God. (Romans 15:12-13)
- 2nd CANDLE (purple) THE BETHLEHEM CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF PREPARATION – God kept his promise of a Savior who would be born in Bethlehem. Preparation means to "get ready". Help us to be ready to welcome YOU, O GOD! (Luke 3:4-6)
- 3rd CANDLE (pink) THE SHEPHERD CANDLE or THE

  CANDLE OF JOY The angels sang a message of JOY!

  (Luke 2:7-15)
- 4th CANDLE (purple) THE ANGEL CANDLE or THE CANDLE
  OF LOVE The angles announced the good news of a
  Savior. God sent his only Son to earth to save us, because
  he loves us! (John 3:16-17)
- 5th CANDLE (white) "CHRIST CANDLE" The white candle reminds us that Jesus is the spotless lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins! His birth was for his death, his death was for our birth! (John 1:29)
