

#### **SANCTITY OF LIFE SUNDAY**

You, heavenly Father, created human life and gave Your children the priceless gift of immortal souls. We give You special thanks on this day for the gift of life. We pray that You will move us mightily to protect and defend the lives of all Your created children, especially the unborn and the infirm. Grant that we entrust our loved ones to Your all-wise and loving care. May we come to You daily in prayer for forgiveness, help, guidance, and insight so that we can continue to show our loved ones a small measure of Your love for us. By the example of our Lord Jesus Christ, who died that all might live eternally, fill us with a spirit of compassion as we minister to those least able to help themselves—the unborn, the infirm, and the elderly. Keep Your children close to You, those unborn and those living, for they have been redeemed by the blood of Your Son, our Savior. Amen.

**The Lord's Supper** is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.

# Confession and Absolution

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

# Old Testament Reading: 1 Samuel 3:1–10

Now the young man Samuel was ministering to the LORD under Eli. And the word of the LORD was rare in those days; there was no frequent vision.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his own place. The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was.

# **Epistle: 1 Corinthians 6:12–20**

"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything. "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become one flesh." 


#### The Words of Our Lord


