


Prayer for the Fourth Sunday of Easter

Salutation and Collect of the Day

First Reading: Acts 4:1-12

As they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand.

On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes gathered together in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well. This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."







So What's the Big Deal ...



about shepherds and sheep? Maybe we understand that the narratives in Genesis make more sense when set in the nomadic, sheepherder culture of the ancient Near East. But why pick up the metaphor again and again in the Psalms and the writings of the prophets?

When we read Ezekiel 34 in light of John 10 and think about the meaning of both texts, we see how aptly the word picture fits.

The "shepherds" Ezekiel excoriates in chapter 34 included both national and spiritual leaders. (Kings were often called "shepherds" in that time and place.) These false shepherds held

their positions as a sacred trust from Yahweh. Yet, instead of functioning as servant leaders, these false shepherds fleeced the flock. Instead of humbly acting in the best interests of their people, these undershepherds led those people away from their one, glorious Good Shepherd.

Ezekiel 34:2-10 outlines what the Lord expected of His undershepherds. They should have

- fed the flock (34:2-3).
- strengthened the weak (34:4).
- treated and cured the sick (34:4).
- gone after the lost and straying (34:4).

The false shepherds did none of this. The straying in their care died in their sins. The spiritually hungry grew weak. The broken languished, separated from their God. In short, the flock was scattered across a dozen hillsides, prey to Satan and ripe for spiritual death. Those who bore responsibility for them let it happen.

Yahweh saw all this. Yahweh knew. He heard His people cry out in hunger and pain. He did not take the arrogance, carelessness, and laziness of the false shepherds lightly. He did not ignore their malfeasance.

No, the Good Shepherd came—in person—to rescue His weak and wandering flock. When you read Ezekiel 34:11-16, can't you picture our Lord Jesus? Can't you see Him

- engaged in earnest conversation with the Samaritan adulteress in John 4?
- touching the paralyzed man in John 5 with His Father's forgiveness and physical wholeness?
- multiplying the loaves and fishes of John 6 while He described to the crowds the bread of life that never goes stale?

This Good Shepherd cares for you, soul--and body-too! In His Word. At the altar. Directly and through other people, He touches, heals, restores, and strengthens you. Thank Him for that today. Pray for those who serve you in His name. Pray that they remain faithful. Ask for a heart quick to hear and obey, by His grace.

The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod traditionally designates the Fourth Sunday of Easter as Good Shepherd Sunday. April 25 is Good Shepherd Sunday this year.



HEART 2 HEART - a Non-Profit

We have been working with this neighborhood group for a few years. Heart 2 Heart provides start-up goods for the homeless who are moving into their own housing. This includes Veterans, sheltered families and battered women, and young people transitioning from foster care. Other organizations find the housing and basic furniture, we provide the start-up needs.

The organization was founded by our neighbor, Linda Garrity, about 10 years ago. Caseworkers provide the names, ages, and needs of the families and a few of us "grandmas and grandpas" put together the orders for these families and load them into the cars for deliveries.

Donations come in from our neighbors and from those who have heard about Heart 2 Heart through word of mouth. Additionally, we scour thrift stores and purchase some new items, especially toys for the kids. One organization provides homemade quilts!

Needed donations include lightly used bedding, towels, books, toys, kitchen items such as pots, pans, dishes, cups, mugs, glasses, silverware, coffeemakers (each Veteran gets one), plastic storage like Glad or Tupperware, baking dishes, spatulas, etc. We do not deal with food, furniture, or clothing. However, we do purchase outfits for newborns, as no baby should leave the hospital in hand-me-down clothing.
