Midweek of Lent 4

Breaking Down the Gates

"Jesus, refuge of the weary, Blest Redeemer, whom we love, Fountain in life's desert dreary, Savior from the world above" (LSB 423:1). Judean exiles in Babylon were weary! They were stuck with sights and sounds that were so different. How they longed to be free! Enter Cyrus, a Persian king, whom God calls His "anointed one" (Isaiah 45:1). When we feel as though the devil has locked the gate and thrown away the key, God sends us Jesus, who is the Anointed One! During His earthly ministry, He opened eyes and ears and hearts—He even opened graves! At one point Jesus promised, "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36). And so we sing, "Jesus, may our hearts be burning With more fervent love for You; May our eyes be ever turning To behold Your cross anew" (LSB 423:3).

The **Call to Worship/Confession and Absolution** is drawn from the Seven Penitential Psalms, so named by Cassiodorus (c. AD 485–c. AD 585) in the sixth century AD. For centuries, Psalms 6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, and 143 have served as a source of prayer and reflection during Lent. Their honest confessions invite us to turn to our Lord with the same spirit of candor and humility.

Call to Worship Psalm 51

P Have mercy on me, O God, according to Your unfailing love; according to Your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

- Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.
- P For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.
- Against You, You only, have I sinned and done what is evil in Your sight, so that You are proved right when You speak and justified when You judge.
- All: Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.
 - P Surely You desire truth in the inner parts; You teach me wisdom in the inmost place.
 - Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow.

 - Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.
- All: Do not cast me from Your presence or take Your Holy Spirit from me.
 - Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.
 - You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; You do not take pleasure in burnt offerings.
 - The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, You will not despise.
- All: And so we come to You, O God, with broken spirits and contrite hearts, trusting only in the merits of Jesus to cleanse, heal, and forgive us.
 - P Upon this your confession, I by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word proclaim the grace of God to all of you and in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ I announce to you the full and complete pardon for all your sins; in the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- All: O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare Your praise!

Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped, to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings, to open doors before him that gates may not be closed: "I will go before you and level the exalted places, I will break in pieces the doors of bronze and cut through the bars of iron, I will give you the treasures of darkness and the hoards in secret places, that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name. For the sake of my servant Jacob, and Israel my chosen, I call you by your name, I name you, though you do not know me. I am the LORD, and there is no other, besides me there is no God: I equip you, though you do not know me,

that people may know, from the rising of the sun and from the west, that there is none besides me; I am the LORD, and there is no other.

I form light and create darkness,
I make well-being and create calamity,
I am the LORD, who does all these things.

"Shower, O heavens, from above,

Epistle Reading: Hebrews 6:13-20

For when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore by himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently waited, obtained the promise. For people swear by something greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath, so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 9:27-34

And as Jesus passed on from there, two blind men followed him, crying aloud, "Have mercy on us, Son of David." When he entered the house, the blind men came to him, and Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to him, "Yes, Lord." Then he touched their eyes, saying, "According to your faith be it done to you." And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly warned them, "See that no one knows about it." But they went away and spread his fame through all that district.

As they were going away, behold, a demon-oppressed man who was mute was brought to him. And when the demon had been cast out, the mute man spoke. And the crowds marveled, saying, "Never was anything like this seen in Israel." But the Pharisees said, "He casts out demons by the prince of demons."


