

Prayer for Seventh Sunday after the Epiphany

Lord Jesus: You are the truth and at all times speak the truth; You urge us to ask the Father for every good thing in Your name; You assure us that the Father will not refuse us; You tell us that the Father loves us and wants to hear our petitions. Oh, what grace and favor have been showered upon us, poor sinners that we are! How can we ever thank You for giving us Your Holy Spirit through whom You Yourself and Your words enter our hearts and minds, assuring us that we are God's dear children and that we can bring our petitions to God the Father in Your name? Grant that, in the face of such divine grace and favor, we never seek to make our way through this troublesome earthly life foolishly trusting in our own abilities and strength. Rather, dear Jesus, may we always ask the Father in Your name for the guidance, strength, and wisdom we need to make our way homeward. Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.

For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. . . .

Why am I in danger every hour? I protest, brothers, by my pride in you, which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die every day! What do I gain if, humanly speaking, I fought with beasts at Ephesus? If the dead are not raised, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die." Do not be deceived: "Bad company ruins good morals." Wake

up from your drunken stupor, as is right, and do not go on sinning. For some have no knowledge of God. I say this to your shame.

But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" You foolish person! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. For not all flesh is the same, but there is one kind for humans, another for animals, another for birds, and another for fish. There are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is of one kind, and the glory of the earthly is of another. There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; for star differs from star in glory.

So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable.

Pathway To Hope ministry Update



Through Lutheran World Relief, there are quilts on the way to Uganda! Only Solomy has a bed. All 21 children and Gerald (Solomy's son) sleep on the hard floor, with only a mat to lay on. When they

relocated to their new home (on February 4, 2022), they left behind the infested foam pads and are in need of new ones. The plan is to build bunk beds for the children.

Other immediate needs are mosquito netting, food and water.

Currently the children are learning the Lord's Prayer and the Apostles Creed. They know how to sing "Jesus Loves Me." They have religious classes every day studying Luther's Small Catechism..

Solomy lost her husband over a year ago and Gerald, their son, lost his job when he had to sell his motorcycle during the Covid lock down to buy food. Their Website was hacked and they lost any money from that.

A REPORT ON PATHWAY TO HOPE MINISTRY OF MITYANA UGANDA



February the 4th of 2022 is date to remember. Solomy and her son Gerald and their 21 Orphan Children have taken possession of their new rental home. The rent is only \$150 per month as compared to \$145 for a much smaller place.

The move was possible by the help of Nicholas, from a Lutheran church, who traveled over 270 miles to help them get settled in. He brought face masks, children's Christian Readers and a copy of Luther's Small Catechism, for Gerald, plus a Bible.

We have been assisting them with rent and food since October of 2021.

This is the first time I have seen Solomy smile. She has a separate enclosure for cooking and can now do two pots at the same time.

Gerald now has his own copy of Luther's Small Catechism and the children have new Readers. They have cleaned the new home and Gerald has begun a search for a job. Please pray for his success.

There is still much to do. In the Home layout drawing, you can see that they have three class rooms and a large bedroom for Solomy and the children. Gerald will bunk in what was the garage. This is where they will also store all of the food supplies. The large central room will serve as a general meeting room and dining hall.

The plan is to build three level bunks and add foam mattresses. They have left behind all the old infested and crumbled foam mattresses and will sleep on Mats for now.

Toilet and bath facilities are in an attached building, in the back. The kitchen is a separate building.

I am encouraged at the progress made. Now we need to provide a funding base to take care of their physical and health needs into the future.

The need for education is important. They plan to hire three teachers that will cost much less than sending the children to local schools of which most are Roman Catholic. The cost to send the 19 of 21 children that should be in school, is $\$25 \times 19 = \475 per month. Using three teachers is only \$163.75 per month after startup costs. See details below.

The startup costs for school supplies and three black boards plus some sort of seating will be about \$500.

The following detail of costs is from Brother Mulero Paul Nicholas who was representing a Lutheran church 275 miles away.

School terms are 4 months long and three per year.

Hi brother Walter, have been communicating with Muwaya Gerald, here is a simple budget for the children's education for this year home schooling. I realized it needs three teachers to teach 6 classes as children are in different classes, first term, is as follow: sets-\$5, pencils-\$2, books-\$37, pens-\$11, Black board-\$88, chalk-\$6, ream of paper-\$5, chat-\$5, toilet paper-\$3, text books-\$270, black books for teachers-\$44, salary for teachers-\$530, exams-\$10, transport-\$58, total=\$1074 Divide that by 4 = **\$268.50 per month.**

Here will be second term: pencil-\$2, books-\$37, pens-\$11, chalk-\$5, exams-\$10, teachers salary-\$530, total=\$653 or **\$163.25 per each month following,**

Food costs per month for the whole family is as follows, from Gerald.

This is budget of food costs per month: Rice 210kg@\$220, Maize flour 240kg@\$180, Sugar 45kg@\$52, Beans 90kg@\$80, Water@\$15, Cooking oil 10litres@43, Firewood 1trip@\$60, Breads @\$15, Meat@\$52, Spices@\$60.

That totals \$777 per month. About \$34 each or just over \$1.10 per day-per person.

So, rent \$150 per month

Food \$777 per month

School \$164 per month-After startup cost of \$500

\$1091 per month or \$45 per person.
