Prayer for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

God, You have a great affection for "those who fear You" and are full of pity toward all men, especially those who believe in Your Son. As Psalm 103 reminds us: "You know how we are formed; You remember that we are dust." Who should know our "frame" better than You! Let us never forget that we are dust-people and we live in dust-bodies. At death the richest and poorest among us will again return to dust. You, O God, know how weak and frail we really are. Because You pitied us, You sent Your Son to take on a dust-body and, in that body, to pay for the sins of our lost, helpless world. You pity us in our guilt and pronounce us clean in Christ Jesus. You pity us in our troubles and promise to hear our prayers. Because You remember that we are dust, with mortal hearts pulsing in our breasts, You send Your Spirit to strengthen, guide, and cheer us. O gracious God, may we trust that, for Jesus' sake, You will continue to pour out upon us the mercy that fills Your fatherly heart. Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to

eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.
