Prayer for the Festival of the Holy Trinity

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of His glory." On this festival Sunday celebrating Trinity Sunday, we come to sing Your praise, O Lord God. Let us find joy in humbly bowing to the mystery of Your essence. You have clearly revealed that You are one God, yet three distinct persons: the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are one in nature, essence, operation, and mission. May we be reminded of our catechism instruction wherein we learned that each of the three persons is God and in each person God is completely present. Also, the Athanasian Creed instructs us: "There are three persons in the Godhead and this one God is to be adored in the three persons." How this can be, we leave to You. Grant us the faith to accept who You are based on what You say, not on what we understand. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we sing Your praise today. Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but

His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.



The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth." And it was so. And God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

And God said, "Let the waters swarm with swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the heavens." So God created the great sea creatures and every

living creature that moves, with which the waters swarm, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures according to their kinds—livestock and creeping things and beasts of the earth according to their kinds." And it was so. And God made the beasts of the earth according to their kinds and the livestock according to their kinds, and everything that creeps on the ground according to its kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." And God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit. You shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the heavens and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. 

Athanasian Creed

Spoken Responsively

Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.

Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.

And the catholic faith is this,

that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.

For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.

But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.

Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:

the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated:

the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;

the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.

And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,

just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.

In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;

and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.

Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.

The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.

The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;

but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal, so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.

Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.

He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:

perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;

equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.

Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:

one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God;

one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.

For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,

who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead,

ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.

And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.

This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.







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The Feast of the Holy Trinity

On the Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates the Holy Trinity and teaches us to confess the mystery of who God is. We are baptized into the name of the only true God: the name "Father, Son and Holy Spirit." There is only one name, only one true God – but God is three persons. This is the great mystery of the Holy Trinity.

On Trinity Sunday, we confess the triune God by reciting the Athanasian Creed. At most Divine Services, we recite the Nicene Creed or the Apostles' Creed. These creeds state what we believe about God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Athanasian Creed goes into great detail to confess the catholic [universal] faith: "that we worship one God in three Persons, and three Persons in one God."

The Time of the Church

The time after Pentecost is the third division of the church year; it comprises about one half of the calendar year and is called the Time of the Church. This time begins with the Feast of the Holy Trinity, a celebration of the mystery of God, three in person but united in substance. The color of the paraments for Trinity Sunday is white, since that is the color of divinity and perfection.

The color of the paraments for the remaining Sundays after Pentecost is green, signifying life, refreshment, and regeneration.



The Sign of the Cross

"Pastor, I don't know how to pray; there isn't a single word that comes to my head." Alice's son lay dying. Dread and tears were the only things that came easily to her right now.

"Alice," the pastor answered, "what you need then is a wordless prayer. When you don't know what to pray, make the sign of the cross."

Her eyes opened as wide as her grief-swollen lids would allow. "I've never really done that. I don't think I know how."

The Pastor's hand traced a cross in the air, touching his forehead, heart and shoulders. "The person who makes the sign of the cross is simply saying, "I am God's child. My baptism makes that sure. Whatever happens, I will rest securely knowing my heavenly Father is watching over me. Even if I cannot pray, Christ my Savior is interceding for me, and the Holy Spirit will keep me safe by His grace."

"But isn't that a Catholic thing?" Alice asked.

"No," said the Pastor, "it comes from a time before there were Lutherans and Catholics. People have been doing this in the church since at least the second century. Some people think it was even done during the time of the apostles."

Alice looked puzzled. "Then why don't Lutherans do it?"

The Pastor laughed. "They do! At every service I make the sign of the cross over the congregation at the Invocation and Benediction. It's even in the *Small Catechism*. Luther taught that, in the morning, when you rise up, make the sign of the holy cross and say, 'In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.' That reminds us that, in spite of our sin, God will hear our prayers because Jesus has died for us."

Alice stood, and made the sign of the cross. Then, she reached over and signed the cross in the air above her son. "He is baptized, too, Pastor. The promise is for both him and for me. His Father will take care of him."

The Pastor laughed again, but this time to hold back tears. "Alice, you are very wise."
