The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but

His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.

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


Personal prayer of thanksgiving after receiving the Sacrament





Paul tells us to make the best use of our time and seek the Lord's will. We are to be wise and not act foolishly in our lives.

As does the Lord, employers want workers who use their time wisely and aren't foolish. No matter what our vocations are, we should work as if we are working for the Lord—demonstrating wisdom and using our time wisely while we continually seek to know the Lord. Our vocations also provide us with opportunities to show our fellow workers forgiveness and the love we know in Christ. Then, at the end of the day, we can rest—knowing we are in the Lord's care, and He will give us peace each night and eternally.
