Prayer for the Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost

O God, You are an eternal Spirit that we mere men cannot quantify or measure. We cannot escape from You. You are always close by but at the same time far away. No distance is so remote that You would not be there. Nor can we conceal ourselves from You, for in that very spot where we are minded to hide, there too is Your all-seeing eye. You fill heaven and earth with Your presence. Let us, with Luther, realize that You do not descend from heaven, but are and remain there, and at the same time, You are and remain here on earth. According to Your natural being You are everywhere present; yet according to Your spiritual being You are to be found only where You are known: where Your Word, Spirit, faith, and worship are. May we be comforted by Your gracious presence that tolerates no human restrictions and limitations whatsoever. Through the work of Your Son keep our souls in endless peace. Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.
