The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body

Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:17-34), and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to communing with us for the first time. We thank you for respecting our belief and practice regarding the Lord's Supper.

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





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The Season of Advent



The Season of Advent, which begins today, is a time of preparation for the coming of Christ: both His coming in the incarnation at Christmas and His second coming at the end of the world as King and Judge. The word Advent is from the

Latin, meaning "coming into." The story of Jesus in Advent is the story of hope coming into the world. The chief emphasis of Advent is on preparation, preparation that is penitential, anticipatory, and hopeful in spirit. The traditional color of the Advent is purple, emphasizing its penitential nature. The optional color for Advent is blue, symbolizing anticipation and hope in our coming King.

The Advent wreath is used to mark the four weeks of Advent, with one candle being lighted for each week of Advent (that is, one lighted for the first week, two lighted for the second week, and so on). The use of the Advent wreath—a wreath of evergreen branches with four candles—symbolizes "the age before the coming of Christ, when the prophecy concerning the Messiah became brighter and brighter until He Himself came and said, 'I am the light of the world.'" Three of the candles on the wreath are purple. The fourth candle, the rose-colored one, will be lighted on the third Sunday in Advent when the congregation observes Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. The wreath will be removed before Christmas Eve when the season of Advent is over.
