And now that He has risen and lives forever, we too may live new lives filled with hope and joy in the knowledge that God has rescued us from the power of sin, death, and the devil. We know too that He hears our prayers and gladly receives our worship.

May God continue to give us His good gifts this Easter season and throughout the year, and may He enable us to offer ourselves to His service, in this life, and in the life to come.
