BE A PART OF SOMETHING BIG!

YOUWE have a unique opportunity to be part of something (*pardon the expression*)...**HUGE!** Yes, I do mean **HUGE** as we celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation in worship on October 29th both in our morning worship services and again that afternoon with our brothers and sisters in Christ from our Winter Haven Circuit.

What a day this will be! But you see, we must be careful because the day is NOT about us...*IT'S ABOUT JESUS!* Just like October 31, 1517 when Martin Luther first nailed those 95 theses (statements) to the doors in Wittenberg, it was about Jesus then and is STILL all about Jesus. Just think, it all started with a lowly monk who, as he studied God's inerrant Word, saw that word being changed and transformed and no longer taught correctly. Luther saw Jesus work on the cross being minimized if not totally disregarded more and more with the emphasis for salvation being placed more and more on what you can do to earn your salvation. Salvation at the time of Luther was becoming more and more based on works and less and less on Jesus. Luther stood up and tried to remind the church of his day that salvation then was all about Jesus. The same holds true 500 years later that salvation is *ALL ABOUT JESUS*—what *HE* did for us on the cross and through the empty tomb of Easter. Luther wanted the church to see that we are not saved by our works but salvation is found in Christ ALONE!

So here we are 500 years later and guess what... Our 21st century society is as much in need of a Reformation as was the 16th century. People today (yes, even churches today) continue to believe, teach and confess that salvation is found in you being a good person, in you doing good deeds, in you being a good member of society and in you giving of your resources to help others. Totally ab-

sent in their equation is JESUS. Yup, just like 500 years ago, the Reformation is *STILL ABOUT JESUS!* It was about Jesus then. It is about Jesus today. I guess the more things change, they remain the same!

So here we sit with the AWESOME Gospel proclamation that sadly we tend to keep to ourselves instead of living boldly and sharing with others. I am fully convinced that if we did live boldly to share this message with others, we would be increasing the numbers of God's kingdom by leaps and bounds. We have that Gospel message that "**it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast**" (Eph. 2:8-9). You see, there is no way you can earn or buy your salvation. It is God's free gift to you! That's what Luther said then and we say today—500 years later the message remains unchanged...It's ALL about Jesus! Let's be clear about what Scripture teaches. Salvation is a GIFT of God. It is grace...all grace...sweet, amazing grace. None of us deserves it. None of us can prove ourselves worthy of it.

God has grace for your life...grace to forgive...grace to remove guilt...grace for a clear conscience...grace to get off the performance treadmill...grace to relieve your hurt. Grace...it's an amazing thing!

Maybe your life has been spent trying to prove yourself to God. Maybe you've avoided God because all you thought He did was wag His finger in your face. Take another look. See God as He really is. He is GRACIOUS.


Growing in the Grace of Giving

"Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl. 9:10).

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord's Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil—those who live contrary to God's will—and to reward those who do good—those whose lives are lived in conformity with



God's will. Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God's temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God's own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them

to do good works in accordance with God's will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are to support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God places a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence, our prayers, and on our time, talents, and treasures. So, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10). Pray for your family, for your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.



500th Reformation

Five Hundred Years 1517-2017

As a young monk and professor at the University of Wittenberg studying the Psalms and the Book of Romans for a series of lectures, Martin Luther became convinced that the remedy for the problem of sin could be found in God's Word. On October 31, 1517 when he nailed his 95 thesis to the doors of the Wittenberg

Cathedral, he shattered the belief that salvation could be earned or purchased for the price of indulgences (buying shares of God's forgiveness offered for sale by the Roman Catholic Church). In his theses, Luther stated that *"we should not rely on the treasury of indulgences, but upon the real treasury of God's wonderful grace, the holy Gospel."* Salvation was, and is, God's free grace through faith as revealed by the Holy Spirit in Scripture. That is what we believe, teach and confess, and that is what we celebrate at Reformation—God's amazing, wonderful, redeeming grace!

This year we will celebrate the **500th** Anniversary of the Reformation on **Sunday, October 29th**. On that day we will gather for joyous worship celebrations at 8:00 & 10:30 of our heritage as Lutheran Christians under the redemptive grace of Jesus Christ. Our services will focus on the Reformation, using a blend of both familiar, traditional hymns (many of which were written by Luther), contemporary songs and special anthems by our choir and special music by our instrumentalists. Make plans now to join us for this celebration of our rich heritage as Lutheran Christians! That's Sunday, October 29th!

Then beginning at 3:30 that same day with pre-service music by musicians from our Winter Haven Circuit churches (including many from Hope), we will begin our annual Reformation Festival right here at Hope! We are so very blessed to have as our guest speaker, Rev. Dr. David Schmitt, Professor of Practical Theology, Concordia Seminary, St. Louis

Dr. Schmitt will be joining the pastors of our Winter Haven Circuit in an exciting worship that celebrates our heritage as Lutheran Christians as we stand on God's inerrant Word and look to the future as we **CONNECT PEOPLE TO JESUS!** Don't let the day pass without joining us in worship. Let's face it, a celebration like this only happens 500 years!

We are excited to welcome back to Hope, Dan Reichard our FL-GA District, Director of Finance & Administration and Vice President of *Lutheran Church Extension Fund* (LCEF). Dan will share the LCEF story with us and how investments, loans and ministry support can help move our ministry forward.

LCEF is a financial organization that empowers ministry. The concept of "church extension" began back in 1902 when members of several congregations raised \$400 to start a new congregation in a neighboring community. From that inauspicious start, LCEF now empowers ministry through a total asset portfolio of \$1.8 Billion funded by over 50,000 individuals, congregations, organizations and schools (ALL part of our Lutheran Church Missouri Synod!).

The LCEF business model is rather simple:

Your Investments = Congregational + Church Worker Loans + Ministry Support

Dan (who has been a *tremendous* asset/advisor to Hope's Building Committee), will explain these components and how **YOU** can use your financial resources to help move ministry forward. Many congregations in our District have what is known as an *LCEF Advocate* to help answer questions about LCEF. Hope's advocate is *Liz Pfeffer*. Dan will share the LCEF story briefly at both morning services on November 5 AND during Family Bible Hour as well as provide the "goodies" for us during Family Bible Hour.




