

RINGING OF THE BELLS

PRELUDE AND MEDITATION "Love Unknown" sett'g: John D. Vieker The sanctuary is a place of meditation and preparation for worship. Therefore, as the prelude begins, we cease our conversations and quiet our hearts to converse silently with God.

OPENING HYMN

INVOCATION, CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

In the name of the Father and of the \$\psi\$ Son and of the Holy Spirit. P:

C: Amen.

P: The LORD commanded the Red Sea to dry up. He led Israel across the sea as if it were a desert.

He rescued them from their enemies and redeemed them from C: their foes.

- P: The water returned and covered their enemies; not one of them survived.
- C: Then his people believed his promises. Then they sang his praise.
- P: Yet how quickly they forgot what he had done! They wouldn't wait for his counsel!
- C: The people made a calf at Mount Sinai; they bowed before an image made of gold.

- P: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me.
- C: For in my inner being I delight in God's law.
- P: But I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war and making me a prisoner of the law of sin and death.
- C: Who will rescue me from this body of death?

 (Silently reflect on the fact that though our sin is great, Christ's love is greater.)
- P: Hear the good news! The same God who delivered Israel from Egyptian bondage also delivers you from your body of sin and death. Jesus Christ, the Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed and his blood forgives you and sets you free! Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the nations.
- C: That we may give thanks to your holy name and glory in your praise!



Exodus 32:1-14

EXPLANATION TO THE SECOND ARTICLE OF THE APOSTLES' CREED

While it is obviously important to Connect People to Jesus... let us not forget those who need to be "RECONNECTED TO JESUS!" So, as you see, visit or talk to some of our brothers and sisters in Christ that we have not seen for some time...take the opportunity to INVITE them to join us again!

Christ is Risen—Alleluia!

GROWING IN THE GRACE OF GIVING:

"Blessed shall you be in the city, and blessed shall you be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock. Blessed shall be your basket and your kneading bowl. Blessed shall you be when you come in, and blessed shall you be when you go out" (Deut 28:3-6).

This is God's promise to the Israelites as they stood beyond the Jordan outside of the Promised Land. He promises blessing to His people. He will make them prosper, whether they are in the city or the field. He will make their fruit of their work to prosper, whether from the ground or their wombs, their flocks or their herds. He will make them to prosper in all things, whether upon their coming in or their going out.

But there's a catch. He would do this for Israel only "if you obey the voice of the Lord your God" (Deut 28:2b). If they did that, He would cause that "all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you" (Deut 28:2a).

If they didn't obey the voice of the Lord, if they didn't keep the commandments of the Lord and walk in His ways (Deut 28:9), they would be met with curse and woe. The blessings would be replaced with curses. Everything that the Lord promised to prosper and bless would be cursed and fail.

Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus Christ has come into our flesh, fulfilled the law for us – in in our place and for our benefit; died for us – in our place and for our benefit; and is risen from the dead for us – in our place and for our benefit.

By this we have justification before God. We are forgiven, clean, holy, and righteous. The blessing of God is promised to us in Christ Jesus. It depends upon His work and not ours.

All this is ours in Holy Baptism. For in Holy Baptism, God claims us as His own, makes us

His children, His heirs, His holy people. And so it is that the work of our hands and its fruit is holy because we are holy in Christ. It is pressed into His service, and thereby it becomes a blessing to us and to our neighbor.

For this great gift, our reception of the blessings of God because of Christ Jesus our Lord, it is our duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is not in order to receive blessings but because in Christ we already have.

It is with this in mind that we sit down on the first day of the week and set aside as He has prospered us to give to His church for His work of blessing in our midst (1 Cor. 16:2).



Connecting Points

TODAY: we continue in the Season of Lent. Lent is a time of deep repentance for the people of God as we focus on the payment God made for our sins through the sacrifice of His only begotten Son on the cross that we might live. **During this time of Lent**, the singing of our "Alleluia's" is omitted from the vocabulary of the church until we sing them again on the **Day of Resurrection**. While Lent is a season that lasts 40 days, Sundays are NOT included as every Sunday is a mini



celebration of our Lord's Easter victory. The color of the season is *PURPLE*~ the color of repentance and royalty as we reflect on our sins and give thanks for our Lenten King of Glory.
