✠ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY ✠

OBVIOUSLY, we are not in the Lord's House today due to the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic, voluntarily taking measures to slow its spread, and the local government stay-at-home orders. Nevertheless, we are making the Service of the Word available on Hope's [Facebook page](#), beginning at 9:00 am on Sunday mornings. Only a pre-selected group of ten people, or less, are allowed to be in the church on Sunday mornings. By advice and encouragement from the Missouri District office, we are no longer offering times for the Service of the Sacrament during this crisis. However, we continue to find comfort, peace, and strength in our Lord's other means of grace—His Word, Baptism, and Absolution.

✠ THE WORD FOR TODAY ✠

THOSE WHO WAIT ON THE LORD SHALL REJOICE

The people of God are pilgrims and sojourners in this world, looking ahead to a destination yet to come (1 Peter 2:11-20). Though we are now children of God, the fullness of what we shall be has not yet been revealed (1 John 3:1-3). We are those who wait on the Lord. *"The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him"* (Lam. 3:25). Jesus tells us that the wait is just a little while. *"A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me"* (John 16:16). Though you must experience sorrow for a time, though you must live as strangers in a world that is at enmity with Christ, yet your sorrow will be turned to joy when He returns. *"But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength"* (Is. 40:31). The little while of weeping shall be replaced with an eternity of rejoicing in the presence of Christ the crucified and risen Savior. *"And no one will take your joy from you"* (John 16:22).

✠ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ✠

WITH HIGH DELIGHT LET US UNITE (LSB 483)

The hymn of the day for Jubilate Sunday is indeed filled with joy and makes the heart happy to sing. The tune by Martin Franzmann matches the text written by the Moravian Georg Vetter, which was written some fifty or so years after the Reformation. Its confession of faith proves a zeal for evangelism is not unique to our age. Rather happiness in the task is especially seen in those followers who came after Jon Hus. The hymn shows the great importance the Moravians held in having both pastors and people joining together in proclaiming the resurrection of Christ. The hymn embodies this even in its opening phrase, *"With high delight let us unite in songs of great jubilation."* Primarily a commentary on the words of Mark 16:15, *"And he said to them, 'Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation,'"* our hymn contains phrases such as: *"To all earth's ends," "every nation, every land,"* and again *"every nation."* Whatever suffering and hardships come to the followers of Jesus, *"With high delight"* impresses on the hearts and minds of all who sing it that the Gospel grants our work to be a task in which we can continually rejoice, letting praises ring, giving thanks as we sing forth Christ's victory and *"death's undoing."* (from logia.org)

APPLICATIONS FOR SCHOLARSHIPS from the “Roschke-Stohlmann Lutheran Vocations and Education Fund” are now being accepted. Scholarships shall be granted based on motivation, financial and scholarship needs of the applicant as evaluated by the Board of Finance. Scholarships shall be awarded in the following order of priority: 1. Seminary training; 2. Pre-seminary training; 3. Full-time rostered church work training (teacher, DCE, DCO, Deaconess, etc.); 4. Lutheran elementary education; 5. Lutheran high school education. Application must be received by **Monday, May 11, 2020**. Contact the church office for a copy of the application.

But that shows us the real problem with greed: it wages war against our soul – it urges us to place our trust in the things of this world and not in God.
