✠ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY ✠

WELCOME! We are happy that you are worshipping with us. As Psalm 122:1 says, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" Here in the Lord's House our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in His Word and Sacrament to give us His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. ✠ THE WORD FOR TODAY ✠

The Son of God Has Set Us Free from Sin and Death by His Grace

"Wisdom is justified by her deeds" (Matt. 11:19), and the true Wisdom of God, Christ Jesus the incarnate Son, justifies us by His deeds. He prepares His way by the preaching of repentance, but He has suffered the violence of the Law and voluntarily handed Himself over to violent men, that we might eat and drink with Him in His Kingdom and "remain in the house forever" (John 8:35). For He is "a friend of tax collectors and sinners" (Matt. 11:19), and He has rescued us by His grace from the slavery of sin and death. By the proclamation of His eternal Gospel "to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people" (Rev. 14:6), "the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law" (Rom. 3:21), "that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus" (Rom. 3:26). And by hearing the Gospel of Christ Jesus, "whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith" (Rom. 3:25), "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31-32).

✠ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ✠

ON THIS CELEBRATION OF THE 503rd anniversary of the start of the Lutheran Reformation today's service takes on a distinctive nature. Our Divine Service setting is what is known as the *Deutsche Messe*, or German Mass. Designed by Martin Luther as a way to give the congregation ownership of the sung parts of the service, he incorporates what were common tunes to pair with texts in German (as opposed to the Latin sung in the Roman Catholic church of the time). Today we make use of those same chorale-based hymns translated into our native language. Today's choral music features Lutheran composers from the entirety of Lutheranism. The choral prelude this morning is a setting of Martin Luther's *Morning Prayer* by Carl Schalk, the Choral Alleluia is set by Kantor Janssen, the choral offertory is a setting by Jacob Weber, and the communion anthem is an extended setting of *Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word* by Dietrich Buxtehude. Organ settings of *A Mighty Fortress is Our God* are by Charles Ore, Michael Costello, Jeffrey Blersch, John Behnke, and (Lutheran by association) Max Reger.

✠ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP ✠

- **PREPARE** to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- **REFLECT** on Psalm 46 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- **PONDER** today's Hymn of the Day, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

ALL SAINTS' DAY (November 1, 2020) - *GOD'S HOLY PEOPLE IN HEAVEN AND ON EARTH*

Psalm: **Psalm 149** – "The Lord takes pleasure in His people; He adorns the humble with salvation."

Epistle: **1 John 3:1-3** – God makes us His children and we will be like Him when He appears.

Holy Gospel: **Matthew 5:1-12** – Jesus preaches the blessings of the Kingdom of God.
