THE PREACHING OF THE GOSPEL

John the Baptist is the preeminent preacher of the Gospel, for he points the hearer away from himself and toward the Messiah. This from the Augsburg Confession, Article 5:

[V. Concerning the Office of Preaching]

To obtain such faith God instituted the office of preaching, giving the gospel and the sacraments. Through these, as through means, he gives the Holy Spirit who produces faith, where and when he wills, in those who hear the gospel. It teaches that we have a gracious God, not through our merit but through Christ's merit, when we so believe.

Condemned are the Anabaptists and others who teach that we obtain the Holy Spirit without the external word of the gospel through our own preparation, thoughts, and works.

LOOKING FORWARD TO NEXT WEEK'S DIVINE SERVICE

Fourth Sunday in Advent

20 December 2020

This “mini-Bible study” is included for your use in personal devotions or with friends during the coming week as you prepare to hear God’s Word next Sunday. The questions provided after each of the Scripture texts are intended for your thought and reflection.

OLD TESTAMENT – Deuteronomy 18:15-19

1. Moses is preaching here to the children of Israel. What does Moses predict and proclaim? About whom is he speaking?
2. What does Moses say that you (God’s people) shall do when this Prophet comes?
3. What Commandment does this sermon from Moses illustrate?
4. Whose words will this Prophet have in His mouth? What will the Prophet speak?
5. What happens to those who do not listen to this Prophet?

PSALMODY – Psalm 19

1. How do the heavens and the earth proclaim God’s glory? What do they say?
2. What does this Psalm say about God’s Word (testimony, law, etc.)?
3. According to the Psalm what things does God’s Word accomplish?

EPISTLE – Philippians 4:4-7

1. What is St. Paul’s command here? How often are we to do this?
2. Over what do we rejoice as we eagerly await celebrating the Lord’s birth?
3. St. Paul urges us to let our gentleness be known to all people. What reason or basis does he give for doing that?
4. How are you anxious about things this time of year? What help do St. Paul’s words give you to relieve the anxiety?

HOLY GOSPEL – John 1:19-28

1. What was the question that the Jews asked John the Baptist? What was John’s answer?
2. What did John proclaim about the Coming Christ?
3. How did John view his task of preparing God’s people for the Christ? See also John 1:29-31; Luke 3:15-17.
