# ✠ Imposition of Ashes ✠

*Stand*

**P** In the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**C** **Amen.**

**P** Dear brothers and sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ, on this day the Church begins a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection. Our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ.

From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope.

Let us pray that our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son and in the power of His Holy Spirit, might richly bless this Lententide for us so that we may come to Easter with glad hearts and keep the feast in sincerity and truth.

*The ushers will invite you to receive the imposition of ashes at the altar rail. Please proceed to the altar rail using the side aisles and return to your pew using the center aisle. You may return to your pew immediately after you have received the ashes on your forehead.*

*Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.*

**P** Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.

**C** **Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.**

**P** Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.





## Distribution

- For the time being we are practicing continuous flow Communion.
- The pulpit side will be communed first, then the lectern side.
- Please usher yourselves up to Communion one pew at a time, maintaining six (6) feet of separation between family groups, couples, and individuals.
- The host (bread) will be placed into hands, not directly into the mouth.
- The chalice is available for those who desire it and will be cleansed with purificators soaked in Everclear (90% alcohol) after each communicant.
- Individual cups are available for those who want them and are spaced apart in the trays.
