▼ THE WORD FOR TODAY

JESUS MAKES FISHERS OF MEN

The Lord called fishermen to be fishers of men (Luke 5:1–11). The net they would use is the message of the cross, which is foolishness and a stumbling block to the world (1 Cor. 1:18–25). The power of God to save is not in spectacular signs like wind and fire and earthquakes (1 Kings 19:11–21), nor is it to be found in human intelligence and wisdom. The power of God to save comes in the still, small voice of the preaching of Christ crucified. In worldly darkness the disciples could catch nothing. But in the light of Christ, whose Word was attached to the water, the boats were filled with fish. So it is that in Baptism you have been drawn in to the ship of the Church. Though the nets are breaking and some who hear the Word do not believe, pastors continue to cast the net of the Gospel and the Sacraments, that Christians may abide in the boat of the Church and that we may be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks a reason for the hope that is in us (1 Peter 3:8–15).

* THE MUSIC FOR TODAY *

"COME, FOLLOW ME," THE SAVIOR SPAKE (LSB 688). Based on Matthew 16:24, Johann Scheffler wrote four stanzas of this hymn (stanzas 1-3, 5). Stanza four was published with the original stanzas in 1704. Scheffler, a physician by training, was raised as a Lutheran and wrote most of his poetry while still a Lutheran. Later in his life he became a follower of a mystic preacher and found his beliefs more in line with the Roman Catholic church.

№ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

PREPARE to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.

- *REFLECT* on Psalm 16 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 688, "'Come, Follow Me,' the Savior Spake."

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes."

Epistle: Romans 6:3-11 — Baptized into Christ's death and resurrection.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 5:20-26 – Living in Jesus' perfect righteousness (which exceeds that of the

scribes and Pharisees!).

STEWARD SHIP BLURB FOR SUNDAY, July 17: 1 Kings 19:18 – "Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him." Elijah was so sure that he was right – that he was the only one left who had not gone after Baal. But he was too pessimistic; his faith in God was off-center. We can't go by our own wisdom. We must trust the Lord and what He has revealed to us in His Word. Think about how this applies to our support of God's work in the Church with our offering. Take a look in Luther's Small Catechism's Table of Duties to see what the Bible has to say about our giving.

JOIN US FOR THE Lay Bible Institute "Prophet, Prostitute and Prodigals: Hosea's and the LORD's Relentless Pursuit," scheduled for Aug. 6 on the campus of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. The one-day workshop, presented by Associate Professor of Exegetical Theology Dr. Kevin Golden, will focus on the Old Testament prophet, Hosea. "The prophets had a tough calling from the Lord, and Hosea had a rather unique way that he faced that challenge in that the Lord called him to marry a prostitute," said Golden. "Coming forth from that marriage were children that were emblematic of what God's own people had done ... that they had run away from Him. In this workshop, we'll learn from Hosea, his faithfulness to his wife, and in him, we'll see how Yahweh, the Lord Himself, is faithful to us ... most specifically in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

The registration deadline is July 22. Cost to attend is \$20 per person (\$35 with lunch). Open to lay people, students, pastors and others interested in the proclamation of the Gospel, the Lay Bible Institute, offered three times a year by Concordia Seminary faculty members, is an ongoing study of the Bible and how it relates to today's life and events.
