#### **▼ THE WORD FOR TODAY ▼**

#### OUR ONLY HOPE IS IN CHRIST'S RIGHTEOUSNESS

"Unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 5:20). God demands nothing less than perfection and holiness from you in regard to His commandments (Ex. 20:1–17). Your only hope, then, is not in your own goodness but in the goodness of Christ, who did not come to destroy the Law and the Prophets, but to fulfill them for you. In Christ, your righteousness does indeed exceed that of the scribes and Pharisees. For you have been baptized into Christ's death and your sinful nature crucified. Therefore, he who has died has been freed from sin (Rom 6:1–11). You are now raised with Christ to walk in newness of life and to share in His resurrection on the Last Day. Christ has brought you through the baptismal sea "out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Exodus 20:2). Therefore, "consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:11).

#### \* THE MUSIC FOR TODAY \*

All Mankind Fell in Adams Fall (LSB 562). During the Reformation era this hymn was held in high regard as a teaching and confessional hymn of the evangelical faith. It reinforces the theology of original sin. However, in good Law/Gospel format, stanzas 4-6 tell of our Savior Jesus. "To bear our sin and woe and shame," he, "took our place". We can rejoice in the new life we have through Christ's death for our eternal salvation.

#### **▼ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP ▼**

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 19 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 562, "All Mankind Fell in Adam's Fall."

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

THE SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY (July 31, 2022) -

Old Testament: Genesis 2:7-17—God creates Adam from the dust and provides for his bodily needs. Psalm: Psalm 33:1-11—"By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, and by the

breath of his mouth all their host."

Epistle: Romans 6:19-23 — We are freed from sin to be slaves for God.

Holy Gospel: Mark 8:1-9 – Jesus feeds the 4,000, thus showing His re-creation of our bodies as

holy.
