№ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY

WELCOME! We are happy that you are worshipping with us. As Psalm 122:1 says, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" Here in the Lord's House our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in His Word and Sacrament to give us His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136:1).

▼ THE WORD FOR TODAY ▼

IN LIFE AND DEATH, CHRIST FULFILLS THE LAW OF GOD.

The Pharisees ask a Law question. Jesus asks a Gospel question. The Pharisees seek to test Jesus in His own words. Jesus seeks to "test" them in the saving reality of who He is as the Messiah (Matt. 22:34–46). The Law requires you to "fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul" and to "love the sojourner" (Deut. 10:12–21). Failure to keep the Law perfectly brings judgment. On the other hand, the Gospel brings the grace of God given by Jesus Christ, that you may be blameless in the day of His return (1 Cor. 1:1–9). Jesus is David's Son yet David's Lord, true God and true man. He is Love incarnate who fulfilled all the demands of God's Law on our behalf, that we might be saved from the Law's condemnation and sanctified in the Gospel's forgiveness. Thereby we see that "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (1 Cor. 1:9).

▼ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ▼

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL READING we hear about the *Greatest Commandment*, that being to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind" (Matt 22:37). The Hymn of the Day is our response to that instruction. In stanzas one and two we sing of our proclamation that we will love God, who is our strength, tower, love, life, Savior, etc. In stanza three we turn to thanksgiving. We sing, "I thank Thee that my soul is healed by what Thy lips revealed..." This is the heart of the Gospel message! In stanza four we pray that God would keep us watchful and humble and keep us from straying from The Way. The closing stanza finishes with our proclamation that we will love God in our lowest times, not because of the promise of a reward for our actions, but because God first loved us. Our love is a reaction to what has already been given to us, that being, the free gift of grace.

№ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- REFLECT on Psalm 34 in the front part of Lutheran Service Book.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 694, "The Will I Love, My Strength, My Tower"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

Epistle: Ephesians 4:22-28 – Be renewed in the spirit of your minds.

Holy Gospel: **Matthew 9:1-8**—Jesus forgives and heals a paralytic.
